Patient Participation Group Buntingford and Puckeridge Medical Practice

As we merge the Buntingford and Puckeridge surgeries it is clear that procedures are more straightforward with reporting, data analysis and contracting now simpler to manage. There has been no negative impact on patient care and in the eight weeks to 11 September 19,264 telephone calls were made to the practice. There have been 15,700 appointments, 10,545 of which were face to face reflecting a upward trend and 7890 were with a GP. The practice is preparing for the winter months by arranging additional nurse and doctor cover.

The completion of the Puckeridge building upgrades have been delayed, however, these are almost complete and the practice would like to thank everyone for their patience during this time. Once the move is complete the new telephone system will be installed which will provide callers with their position in the call queue and a possible call-back option during particularly busy times. On average, the waiting time for a call to be answered is five and a half minutes. This will be longer at peak times like Monday mornings and before 10am but the general advice is that if you are holding for more than twenty minutes you should hang up and dial again as something has gone wrong.

The practice website is now much easier to navigate using the menu bars. From

November patients who have registered for the NHS App will be able to access their medical records. To register for the NHS App google or search on the App Store. This will send a request to the practice to activate the various features.

Invitations to make an appointment continue to be sent out to anyone with long-term, ongoing health issues and half of the reviews are now completed. Flu and Covid vaccinations are underway with appointment links sent via mobile phone and calls are being made to those who may not have digital means. This year both these jabs can be done at the same time and the programme has been a huge success with over 1300 vaccinations carried out on one Saturday in September – a huge feat of organisation by the whole team. Thank you! Historically, the practice reaches appx 85%+ of over 65s for their vaccinations but have a lower response from vulnerable 18 to 64 years old. If you are eligible, get the jab is still the message. Please note, just because the practice has your mobile phone number it does not automatically mean you will get text alerts. You have to complete the consent form on the electronic communications section at the bottom of any page of the practice website. Text alerts are the fastest and easiest way to know what is happening at any one time and for the practice to get messages to you quickly. If you change your contact details please let the practice know.

We had some discussion regarding the recent change to the government's Health

Secretary and her new initiatives. It was agreed that these will be difficult to achieve without considerable extra resources and that the validity of some of the targets seem questionable. The practice are proud to have maintained an acceptable timeframe for routine matters, with routine pre-bookable face to face and telephone appointments available with doctors, nurse practitioners, nurses, phlebotomists and physiotherapist within 2-3 weeks across both sites. A significant part of practice capacity is taken up with providing on the day access via our triage service for urgent problems. Please consider carefully whether you really do need to be seen the day you call or whether your problem could wait until tomorrow or later in the week as same day appointments are finite. Similarly, if you wish to see a specific doctor then you may need to wait until they have a clear slot. The practice continues to provide extended access into the evening which can also provide a flexible option for face to face appointments and telephone reviews in the evening.

Two well-received online presentations have been made in the Cancel Out Cancer programme.

So, please register your consent for text alerts if you haven't already done so and apply for online access if you wish to access your records when they become available. Get the jabs if you can and stay as fit and healthy as possible as we go into the colder and darker months of autumn and winter, Jenny Dingley.

Friends of the Rib & Quin

We were honoured to be a nominee for the Campaign for the Protection of Rural England (CPRE) Herts Awards for 2022. FORQ Chairman and founder Mark Wilkinson joined other groups at the presentation evening at County Hall in Hertford in October.

CPRE Herts ambition for the awards is to recognise and celebrate people engaged in activities which enhance and protect the Hertfordshire countryside. It was inspiring to hear of the efforts being made by so many people keen to enhance and protect their local environment.

Mark also had the opportunity to talk with Cllr Annie Brewster, Leader of Herts County Council, on the problems of abstraction and pollution that impact the Rib and Quin.

We were thrilled to receive a Gold Award in the Improving and Protecting the Environment Category. Mark was also honoured with a Special Award, with Clare Gooden of the Hiz Conservation Group, in recognition of their contributions to protecting Hertfordshire's chalk streams. We are extremely grateful to ClIr Andrew Huggins for nominating Friends of the Rib & Quin. October 1st saw reports coming in on Facebook and by email saying that there were lots of dead trout in the River Quin at the main ford in Braughing.

The first point of call is to report it to the Environment Agency (EA), via their hotline (0800 807060), this had been done by at least one concerned resident. main ford. He told me they had tested water quality and the foul water drains We were later advised that all the foul water drains were clear and that their

My husband is one of FORQ's Riverfly Monitors (RFM) monitoring several sites around Braughing, he took some water samples whilst he was out walking the dog. He tested the samples when he got home, all were normal for both nitrates and phosphates. This indicated it probably wasn't a sewage discharge that had caused the issue.

He then had a long chat with the EA, via the hotline, and with the landowner at one of the Riverfly Monitoring (RFM) sites, who told him there were dead fish there as well as at the main ford. We headed out to look at the RFM site. Whilst we were out we bumped into somebody from the EA who was testing the water at various points around the village. His results agreed with my husband's.

Early the next day my husband and Mark did a full RFM session at one of the Braughing sites, mainly to see if the invertebrates had also been affected. The count was slightly lower than normal.

I took the dog for his morning walk and met someone from Thames Water at the main ford. He told me they had tested the water quality and the foul water drains. We were later advised that all the foul water drains were clear and that their testing was not showing anything untoward, also that the river had improved during the day.

After contacting the landowners for the other Braughing RFM sites, my husband was given permission to walk the river through their land to see if he could find anything that would help in the investigation. Upstream from Gravelly Lane ford he found large trout swimming happily – again indicating that the cause was unlikely to be a discharge from Dassels STW.

He also contacted Sarah Perry (Living Rivers Officer for Herts and Middlesex Wildlife Trust (HMWT)). Sarah has been involved with several initiatives in Braughing in recent months. Sarah was understandably concerned and involved one of her contacts at the EA in her response.

Sarah suggested that it could have been an Anoxia (oxygen depletion) incident. This can be caused when a long hot dry period of weather is followed by heavy rain, which washes fine particle dust and grit into the river.

We will probably never know what caused this dreadful incident. Sarah's suggestion of Anoxia seems the most plausible. Invertebrates are more resilient to oxygen depletion than fish, which explains why the RFM session gave near normal results.

Events such as this show how valuable citizen science is. The EA is woefully under resourced, so the work FORQ do, on the Rib and the Quin, and the other groups recognised by CPRE at the awards ceremony, becomes even more important.

In the last few months FORQ have also held three RFM sessions on the riverbank with the Beavers, Cubs and Scouts from 1st Braughing Scout Group. We've also presented on the Rib & Quin and Herts Chalk streams to the Hertfordshire Heavy Horse Association, to Chipping & Buckland Parish Council and to Thundridge & High Cross Society.

East Herts Rural Branch

We now have the ward boundaries for East Herts, which has a considerable effect on our area. A new ward of Braughing and Standon, with two councillors, will take in the villages of Standon, Puckeridge and Braughing. The Buntingford ward is enlarged to include some of the villages around it, including Cottered and Hare Street, and will have three councillors. The Mundens ward, instead of including Cottered, is extended southwards to Chapmore End, with one councillor. The Little Hadham ward is extended northwards to include all the Pelhams and Anstey, still with one councillor. High Cross and Thundridge are now in the new ward of Ware Rural, which crosses the constituency boundary into Hertford and Stortford constituency to include Widford and Wareside.

For the Labour Party, these changes mean that ward of Puckeridge is subsumed into Braughing and Standon and the ward of Buntingford is enlarged. Puckeridge and Buntingford are the only two East Herts wards in the NE Herts constituency which we have come close to winning in the past. This now becomes more difficult. It is reasonable to argue that Standon and Puckeridge should be in the same ward as the town of Buntingford. David Bell.

The Sadleir Tombs Refurbishment Project

The magnificent tombs of Sir Ralph Sadleir (1507-1587), his eldest son Thomas and the latter's wife Gertrude are a part of the rich heritage of St Mary's Church, Standon. Described on his memorial as ''faithful to the state and beloved of his countrie", Sir Ralph served three monarchs, Henry VIII, Edward VI and Elizabeth I as courtier, soldier and statesman. The passage of over 400 years had left the memorials sorely in need of cleaning, repair and refurbishment and his return to public notice as a result of the acclaimed Wolf Hall trilogy by Hilary Mantel, in which he features prominently, acted as a spur to get the work started.


In late 2020 an appeal was launched for funds to undertake the work. Generous donations came from descendants of Sir Ralph and from people with a connection to Standon. We received grants from the Leche Trust, the Bedfordshire and Hertfordshire Historic Churches Trust and ChurchCare supported by the Pilgrim Trust. With these funds secured, Sally Strachey Historic Conservation started work on the cleaning and repair in August 2021 and finished within eight weeks. The final part of the refurbishment was the re-gilding of the tombs. Michelle Pepper began this in October 2022 and it was completed in November. The monuments now look resplendent and stand once again as a fitting tribute to this great man and his family. If you are in the village do visit the church and take a look at them.

Thank you to the many people who have either donated to this project or given support in other ways. We couldn't have done this without you.

The Project Committee was sad to hear of the recent death of Dame Hilary Mantel. She kindly agreed to act as patron for the project. Her name, her books and her benevolent interest added impetus and made the task of fundraising considerably easier. It is a sad irony that her death occurred just a day after we placed the contract for the gilding. She will never see his tomb, but she will be remembered in Standon as the person who brought Sir Ralph Sadleir back to life.





This year we started with a late frost which burnt the new shoots and we thought it would be a disastrous season but the amazing summer turned everything round and we ended up having a really good season. We managed to harvest two tons of grapes which for a 'Bijou' vineyard and winery is quite a good result. The fact that that we spend a great deal of time looking after our vineyard and it's in a sunny position really saves the day.

Buntingford Action on Climate Change and Sustainability (BACCS)

How far would you go? You will probably have seen on the television or in the press that environmental activists, Just Stop Oil, have been making the news with controversial actions designed to raise the alarm about the climate and ecological crisis. What has your reaction been? Horror at the throwing of tomato soup on Van Gogh's "Sunflowers" (actual painting protected by glass so no damage done)? Annoyance at roadblocks? Dismay at activists hanging around in hammocks on the Queen Elizabeth bridge at the Dartford crossing?

Whatever your thoughts about their actions and consequences, have you

thought about WHY they are taking these steps? This is the big question and as an environmental campaigner for 30 years, I feel their frustration. World leaders have been aware of the consequences of burning fossil fuels for over 30 years!

Since the first United Nations Earth Summit in Rio de Janeiro in 1992. countries around the world have been negotiating on how we are going to combat "dangerous human interference with the climate system" and despite all the talk, emissions are still rising. In 2018 the IPCC report said we needed to halve emissions by 2030 to avoid the worst effects of climate change but we are going the wrong way. Also on the news, you may have seen scenes of devastating floods in Pakistan and Australia, of terrible droughts in East Africa, resulting in millions becoming homeless and hungry, even dying from starvation because of failed crops – all as a result of the changing climate. These events may feel distant from our lives and, even as we may struggle with our own anxieties with the current cost of living crisis, these events are a reminder of how vulnerable we are to the changing climate.

The environment and biodiversity seem to be very low down on our government's list of priorities and yet it is the one thing that unites us. We all live on the same planet, which sustains us and yet is finite, so surely it should be of highest priority to protect our source of life. The idea of "growth, growth, growth" is just not sustainable – how can it be?

People acting as part of Just Stop Oil, Extinction Rebellion and Fridays for the Future understand the urgency of our predicament and are simply asking the government not to make things worse by opening up more oil and gas fields and surely Insulate Britain had a point –

doesn't it make sense to insulate our homes to reduce energy consumption and lower our bills rather than extricate more oil and gas, which costs us more in both money and environmental damage?

But why so extreme, you may ask? Unfortunately, governments are in the habit of only thinking in the short term, which is why they have been kicking the environmental protection can down the road for so long – the problem (particularly in the wealthier northern hemisphere) has always seemed to be something to worry about in the future. But the future is HERE, and the effects of climate breakdown are happening NOW. We can't afford to kick the can down the road any longer, so someone has to shout loud and the more of us who listen and call on our government to act for our long -term benefit, the better for us and for future generations.

Before the middle of the twentieth century most people did not have watches; they relied on public clocks which could be seen at railway stations, post offices and other public buildings and on church towers. This reminds me of the lines written in 1912 by the homesick poet, Rupert Brooke:

"Stands the church clock at ten to three And is there honey still for tea?"

The Hundred Parishes has a variety of interesting church clocks. In Furneux Pelham, St Mary's clock is topped by Old Father Time and the words "Time Flies, Mind Your Business". One wonders what prompted those words to be included.

The bell tower at Sheering has two clock faces which were installed in the 1940s to remember those who served in the War. The north-facing one tells us to "Work and Pray" whilst the west-facing proclaims "Today Is Yours".

The church at High Wych was built in 1861 to the design of local architect George Edward Pritchett. Its clock is almost as wide as the thin flintstone tower on which it is mounted.

Hinxton possibly has our oldest church clock, believed to date from 1700 AD, albeit extensively renovated in 1809 when a new face was fitted.

Artist Eric Ravilious lived in Great Bardfield and his wood engraving of the

church of St Mary the Virgin clearly shows the enormous clock that was added to commemorate the coronation of King George V in 1912. The engraving is the logo of The Hundred Parishes.

I hope you will keep an eye open for the clocks found in the Hundred Parishes.

www.hundredparishes.org.uk I live in Stansted Mountfitchet. The name is an interesting one: Stansted derives from Saxon language meaning stony place; Mountfitchet is a corruption of Montfiquet, a village in Normandy. A man from there fought with William the Conqueror and was rewarded with land in Stansted.

Several of the Hundred Parishes have names ending in the Saxon STED, STEAD or TED. THAXted refers to the thatch that could be obtained there; BROXted seems to come from BROCK, the old name for badger.

Many of our towns and villages were recorded in the Domesday Book of 1086. Duxford appears as Duchesuuorde, or Duc's Enclosure. Duxford has a number of locations where ancient travellers could FORD the River Cam. There are several more FORDs.

Domesday includes the manor of Pelham, possibly the home or farm of a man called Peola. The Norman family De Furneux added its name to establish Furneux Pelham, while part of the manor was destroyed by fire in the twelfth century and became 'burnt' or Brent Pelham. Stocking Pelham, seems to have adopted an Old English word meaning 'made of logs', perhaps referring to the parish church. HAM appears at the end of more parish names, suggesting that they also arose from someone's home or farm.

Rickling was recorded as Richelinga and may be derived from Ricula who was the wife of Sledd, a 6th-century ruler of Essex.

Ten parish names end in ING, a Norse word for meadow or enclosure

Naming a place...and see if it catches on

I am now calling this' Happy Hill' as everyone I have ever come across there is either smiling or vocal in their appreciation of the peace, beauty and surrounds (mind you, some maybe just relieved they made it to the top!)

On this evening, I happened upon a lady sitting on the very bank.

"Hello lovely snail lady!" she said (not sure if I'm entirely happy with that label, but I'll roll with it could be worse like Earwig / Louse lady)

"Umm hello" I said cautiously, not recalling who she was.

My smallest dog went straight over and asked for a stroke and snuggled her, always a good sign as far as I'm concerned. She then continued "You told me about the lovely Roman Snail colonies around here, you remember?".

I have told many people about them as they are so beautiful and so very perfect as well as an historic connection of encampments of Roman Soldiers who brought them here as 'food on the hoof' kept in leather canisters (we now know them as L'escargot).

Then, in further acknowledgement of herself "Tree Lady?!!". Then I remembered who she was.

She had told me when we met before in early spring , when hedgerows where heavy laden with hawthorn blossom, that she has a very stressful job and she comes to this beauty spot, via Happy Hill , to see a specific tree. Tales from Brockholds Manor

Hedges and Edges

When our children were young like many families, we would listen to audiobooks and also tapes I would make from recordings of Radio 4's brilliant afternoon theatre output, which used to include a number of plays for children during the school holidays. One such was a short run of plays adapted from the 'Borrower' series of children's books by the wonderful author Mary Norton. There was a scene when the Borrowers were living in the countryside, on the edge of a field and the father says to his daughter, in his broad West Country accent, that he is "going to check all the edges around

the field". She corrects him with "Oh papa you mean Hedges", to which he replies, much to my daughters' delight and jollity, "There are Hedges and Edges, and I mean Edges!" All of this is a very roundabout way of saying now is the time to think about planting hedges and in light of the sweltering summer and our struggling wildlife, please don't be too neat and tidy around the edges.

When we moved to Brockholds Manor we had no secure boundaries and occasionally a lost walker who had strayed from the footpaths would find themselves in our garden and more importantly to us, so did small groups of deer and many Muntjac. Trying to grow trees, shrubs and roses when they are constantly grazed off, is not ideal, so we set about securing the boundaries with deer fencing and planting some hedges. We are on a fairly exposed site and in the winter months, the north wind blows straight across our garden and it can be bitterly cold, not good for our lovely plants. Hedges are by far the best windbreak as they filter the wind and slow it down rather than creating drafts and counter flows.

We have planted over 2,000 individual plants, all UK grow and all bought as bare rooted, mail order. UK-grown plants have not been coddled and are strong and used to our weather, so they are the best choice. Choosing what to plant in many ways is very easy these days, it has to be a native species, as there is little point in planting something as large and permanent as a hedge, that won't support any wildlife. With so many insects struggling to survive I feel it is incumbent on us all to do as much as possible to help them and provide habitats for them. After all, they are at the bottom of the food chain their loss has a dramatic effect on everything else including our food





production. Most native species of hedging are also very well adapted to our climate. We have planted both mixed and single species choosing beech as the main boundary hedge on our northern side and mix of Alder, Blackthorn, Buckthorn, Dogwood, Elderberry, Hawthorn, Hazel, Rose, and Wild Pear. In the main garden area, we have created 'garden rooms' with formal yew and beech hedges.

Planted in the spring of 2017 some of this hedging has now reached 10ft. We have hardly ever watered it but did take care to plant it well, with what my mother used to call a '50p hole for a penny size plant'. These days the advice from the RHS is not to add compost at the planting stage. The idea is that by adding nothing the roots must work and grow towards the nutrients rather than just sit in their cosy little perfect hole. After planting, mulch and feed from the top as and when needed. However, if the soil is compacted or as I have seen recently at a new build site, if planting into rubble and concrete, you must dig this out completely and remove it. If your holes are not bigger than the root ball and the water can't drain away, it will just sit there and when we get a ground frost the water will freeze, the roots will rot and the plant will die.

As with everything in our garden here, I have maybe planted more hedges than I can easily maintain. However this year with a little extra focus and going on the 'a little everyday' principle, I have managed to get to grips with cutting the hedge to its final height and we are also getting a good 'batter' on the sides. This has nothing to do with flour and eggs but is when you cut the sides at a slight angle, so they don't splay out at the top and the light gets to the whole hedge, which helps to prevent a bare bottom! If you want to see this on a grand scale just visit

Newmarket, all the hedges both formal and in the countryside have an extreme 'batter' of about 70 degrees.

Whether you choose a hedge of one variety or go for a mix, now is the best time to buy and plant, while the soil is still warm and at last is beginning to be moist. We have found to our cost, planting in late winter or early spring means the plants struggle with our new pattern of dry spring weather. Finally edges, please don't think you need to keep everything too pristine and perfect, there is a place for that but also please have some places where things can be a little wilder. If you have the space leave a foot or more at the bottom of the hedge for frogs, toads and other lovelies to live, forage and overwinter.

which pick up the fob signal and can unlock and start a vehicle. Using a signal blocking fob pouch or storing your fob in a metal box will help prevent the signal being detected.

During a recent attempted theft, a steering wheel lock thwarted the thief and prevented the vehicle being stolen, a good quality lock is a great way to keep your vehicle safe."

To minimise the chance of becoming a victim we offer the following advice:

- Lock your car whenever it is left unattended and keep it in a garage when parked at night if possible.
- Consider fitting CCTV on your home or driveway, to help deter thieves.
- Use PIR or LED security lighting to make your vehicle more visible and this can also act as a deterrent.
- Look for car parks with a Secured Car Park sign which have recognised levels of security. If you have a garage at home, ensure you use it and lock it properly.
- Noisy gravel on your drive can help deter a would-be thief, as they don't want to alert you to their approach.

How to protect your keyless entry car:

- When at home keep your car key (and the spare) well away from the car.
- Put the keys in a screened or signalblocking pouch, such as a Faraday Bag.
- Reprogramme your keys if you buy a second-hand car.
- Turn off wireless signals on your fob when it's not being used.
- Use a steering wheel lock as an extra security measure.

Beware Energy Rebate and Cost of Living Payment Scams

Following the government's recent announcement about energy rebates, we have received reports of fraudsters posing as the energy regulator to try to dupe members of the public into handing over personal and payment details.

One example uses the Ofgem logo and tells you that you are eligible for an energy bill rebate. It claims you have until 1st June 2022 to claim the rebate and you must click on the link in the email to apply. The link takes you to a fake online site with a form to complete in order to 'set up a direct debit'. This is a scam.

Local authorities are administering the energy rebates. Rebates will be issued directly to those who already pay via direct debit, without the need to provide extra details. handing over their personal details. If you receive an email which you believe to be a scam, you can forward it to the National Cyber Security Centre at <u>report@phishing.gov.uk</u>. Suspicious texts

should be forwarded to 7726.





Why Bats Matter

We see them so fleetingly, it's almost as if they are not there .This is much as so many nocturnal creatures. Bit like Toads, Frogs, Lizards, Hedgehogs.

Sadly the loosening red tape of Planning Legislation may make this even worse. We are regularly being advised on the importance of biodiversity but there is conflict between housing and road expansion with Britain being one of the most nature-depleted countries. Over the past 50 years 41% of UK species have declined and 26% of mammals are threatened with extinction. When was the last time you saw a Hedgehog compared to when you were a child?

Britain's 18 species, (bet you didn't know that!) of Bat's make up a quarter of Who knew ?!? Well I do now. our mammal species. A common pipistrelle (tiny and so cute) can eat

2,000 insects (small annoying bugs) in one night.

In October, I had a small Long Eared Bat take temporary residence on a beam in my lounge. He was utterly still. Soon as I saw him (well my pup actually indicated he was there) I called Roger aka Batman from the Wildlife Trust. Next night Batman came, 'unhooked' the Bat, and took him to the 'Bat Hotel'. He was dehydrated and needed feeding up before going into hibernation. A week late Batman Returned bringing Bob to release back to his local territory.

I explained that I plant lots of nectar providing plants which so many bugs feed on and Roger agreed these are vital for Bees and Bats!
