# A Tribute to Rachel Pinkney

I first met Rachel and her husband Fred in 1975 when I joined Standon Morris Men, as they were then called. I am sure that everybody who knew Fred remembers him as a larger than life figure but behind the scenes I think Rachel was the boss.

I was not aware, in those early days of knowing them, of their role in the reestablishment of Standon May Day in the life of the community. Pictures and local newspaper cuttings I know exist in the village documenting this and the story of how it was done can be found on-line. This occurred in 1974 and having been involved with the celebrations each year since 1976 I do of course want to place firmly on record that I believe we all owe a debt of gratitude to Rachel, Fred and all the other pioneers, and then their successors, for placing this charming event back in the village social calendar.

Many years ago I was asked to be the MC in the arena and those of you who have been present in recent years will know that Rachel always took a seat towards the side of the stage to watch the children dancing and the Morris Dancing displays. I always introduced her to the audience as the lady to thank for our tradition continuing and although she always told me off for doing so I have had it on good authority since her passing that she was inwardly very pleased and that gives me pleasure.

Rachel was also involved in other folk traditions in the village. In the 1970's and 1980's the revival of old customs and festivals generated a more widespread audience for folk music and dance. Standon Morris were then at the start of a long period of dance performance with large numbers, as were the Hoddesdon Crownsmen Rapper Sword team, including many common memberships of both sides

But these were of course all male sides, other than the lady members of the Crownsmen who performed Appalachian Clog dancing. Rachel and other ladies decided that the wives and girlfriends should have their own team and thus Hertfordshire Holly was born to perform the North West England Clog Morris dances.



As with all clubs people come, people go, as do circumstances and ideas. Some of the ladies including Rachael did not want to follow the example of Standon Morris and travel to weekends away at organised dance festivals, or holidays away elsewhere in the UK. And so there was the formation of another team, Standon Green Morris, led and coached by Rachael who performed locally and of course at May Day. That side ceased some while ago but it is another part Rachel's legacy. As of course is Hertfordshire Holly, the original side, which continues to this day,

She was also involved nationally as the Treasurer of The Morris Federation.

Lots of you will have known her as a neighbour of friend and will have your own memories of her. I would just like to say that I for one was proud to have numbered Fred and Rachel as my friends, and colleagues, at Morris and of course May Day.

My condolences and thoughts go to Vince, Amanda and Gerard and all the family in their loss but I hope that in writing this short article, at the request of others, I have done a little to embed their mother's name in the folklore of the village.

Many people have said with advancing age that they hope that they made a difference. Rachel, you did!

# **Patient Participation Group**Buntingford and Puckeridge Medical Centre

The Buntingford and the Puckeridge surgeries operated contractually as two separate entities until quite recently. This 'separateness' has now ceased as the two GMS (General Medical Services) contracts have finally been merged with joint policies, practise, and governance in place. Administrative workload is reduced as things now only need to be done once rather than for each surgery individually.

Once again, the number of face to face appointments continues to rise with 10333 of the 16506 appointments handled in this way during the eight weeks to 15 May. Over 7000 of these appointments were with a GP. 'Did Not Attend' data is monitored carefully and numbers remain low as most people are very good at informing the surgery if they are no longer able to attend their allocated slot. This is so important as the space can be reallocated to someone else in need so please, if you are unable to make your appointment, let the surgery know

National guidance on infection control measures continues to change and the Practice has given this serious thought. Because the people attending the surgeries are frequently the most vulnerable in our community the decision has been made for clinicians and patients to continue to wear masks at the Surgery, certainly for the time being.

The telephone system will be updated and call back and queue number options should be rolled out in early autumn.

We had discussions regarding planning for changing demographics as new housing development increases numbers of people with young families moving into the area. The demands on the system created by this must be balanced against the needs of those already resident, especially the older population who are tending to live longer and often have a range of complex issues. The ethos of the Practice is one of family-focussed continuity of care with a strong relationship between patients and their GP, built over time. The Practice has been very successful in recruiting staff who are attracted to this philosophy, and it continues to be proactive to ensure adequate capacity is in place to meet demand. The main 'precluder' to this has been the lack of space.

The practice continues to pursue premises options and are considering several options. Each option has its own considerations but the over-riding priority is for longevity. The current Buntingford site is not big enough for purpose and noone wants to end up back in the same position in ten years' time, having to repeat the task of finding somewhere else because the premises are, once again, outgrown. The extended Puckeridge site should be fully operational by the end August/early September.

We all know that it can be very difficult to get a hospital appointment and that waiting lists for almost all clinics are sometimes frighteningly long. The Practice is proud that it is able to continue to manage each patient whilst they are waiting to access a hospital clinic or undergo surgery although this does mean an additional load on the service that should, in an ideal world, have been passed on to a hospital. Most times they get things right, but they do acknowledge that, sometimes, things do not go according to plan and that occasionally someone may not be happy with the service they receive. If you have any concerns regarding your experience with the Practice, please do contact the Practice Manager who will always be available to hear your story. The Practice can only improve if they are made aware of any issues and it is not helpful to anyone for dissatisfaction to be expressed on social media sites although, in reality, the positive generally outweighs any negative.

If you are over 16 years of age and a registered patient of the Practice who is interested in supporting the PPG in cooperation with the Practice please do get in touch by completing the Patient Group sign-up form available on the Practice website. We are particularly keen to recruit younger members of our community. Meetings are currently held online for an hour, every couple of months. Whilst on the subject of the website, if there anything you think is inaccurate or something that you feel would be useful to include please contact the Practice Manager with your thoughts.



Yes the land maybe privately owned, but the Right to Roam across it is publicly owned and that must be there for generations to come.



# Buntingford Action on Climate Change and Sustainability (BACCS)

Buntingford's Alternative Car Show I hope you have all managed to stay comfortable during our long, hot summer.

Not only has the heat been challenging but we have also faced huge hikes in fuel and energy prices as I am sure you don't need me to tell you.

You may have been considering buying or leasing an electric car to save on fuel prices and, as a Nissan Leaf owner, I would say that if you can, do it. I have had mine since March 2021 so have had 18 months to get used to it. It isn't brand new being a 2018 reg but it's a bit like buying a house - you get the best you can afford at the time. Even if it seems a big outlay, you soon reap the benefits.

After all, with inflation being as high as it is but interest rates on any savings you may have not giving you the same return, it is not necessarily a bad idea to invest in something that will save you money over the coming years.

We have an electric charging point on the house which means you can charge the car at your convenience and cost about £600 to install last April. There is a new

government grant scheme (OZEV) which provides funding of up to 75% towards the cost of installing electric vehicle smart chargepoints at domestic properties across the UK - https://www.gov.uk/ government/collections/governmentgrants-for-low-emission-vehicles which is worth taking advantage of.

Typically, it costs me just over £2.00 to charge the car overnight on a special tariff and this will take me a minimum of a 100 miles - so what's not to like!

# OK, so maybe you are thinking this could be a good idea but what about range anxiety?

It is true that you do need to be more mindful of your journeys and to make sure that there is enough charge in the battery to get you where you are going but, in my opinion, it is worth the extra time and trouble to know that your journeys are not contributing the same amount of emissions as a petrol or diesel

Some more modern electric cars have a range of around 350 miles so they are definitely improving. We realise that electric cars are not strictly zero emission when you take into account the manufacturing and the sourcing of precious metals so are not the answer to a

net zero emission transport system - it would still be better to use public transport, especially if that were run on renewable electricity. However, living in Buntingford or surrounding villages, we have a sparse service and it is not always practical.

There are apps you can use on your smart phone, which tell you where all the charging points are on your journey and at your destination so that you can plan accordingly. If you don't fancy taking the full plunge with a totally electric car, you could consider a hybrid car.

If you want to find out more about what it is like to own and drive an electric or hybrid car come and find us at the **Alternative Car Show** in the town car park, running alongside the Buntingford Car Show on Saturday 3rd September between 11am and 4pm showcasing a number of electric and hybrid vehicles and the owners happy to answer any questions.



# Friends of the Rib and Ouin

FORQ have been conducting Riverfly Monitoring and Water Quality Testing at several points along the Rivers Rib and Quin for over a year now, so we are starting to be able to see trends developing.

We were therefore very concerned when, in early July, we found that the Phosphate levels at one of the sites in Buntingford were suddenly too high for our monitoring equipment (we use Hanna HI713 Phosphate Colorimeters) to measure. Meaning that the levels were above 2.50ppm (parts per million).

Looking at the data over recent months from the other sites on the Rib the levels were still higher than they should be but lower than in Buntingford. The figures for the River Quin in Braughing were lower still.

More data was needed for us to confirm our suspicions so a day of testing was conducted at chosen sites on the Rib between Buntingford and Wadesmill.

Our first test site, at Buntingford Watermill on Luynes Rise, is above the Thames Water Sewage Treatment Works, this gave a reading of 0.52ppm. This is approximately 7 times what might The data collected in this snapshot test, be expected in a 'natural' chalk stream. Our next testing point, at Aspenden Road, is below the STW, this is the site where we had seen the Colorimeter "max out" on the regular test day. It did so again, meaning the water there has well in excess of 30 times the level of

phosphate present compared to that expected in a chalk stream.

The next three sites, at Westmill North Bridge, A10 Hay Street Bridge and Hamel's Mead, all produced the same reading of greater than 2.50ppm. It wasn't until a test taken from water at Braughing Railway Bridge that phosphate levels fell back to within the parameters of the Colorimeter, with a reading of 1.56ppm. Here the River Rib has been diluted by the River Quin with its lower phosphate levels.

After the test site in Standon (which is near the A120 bridge and also gave a reading of 1.56ppm), the River Rib is further diluted by discharges from Standon STW and possibly other springs. We believe Standon STW has phosphate stripping infrastructure. This meant that the river above Latchford gave a reading of 1.26ppm, before rising again to 1.69ppm at Barwick Ford, where private sewage treatment discharges at Latchford, Hanging Wood and Barwick will probably have contributed phosphate. There was a fall again in the test result at Cold Christmas (1.27ppm) but they rose again at Wadesmill (1.57ppm).

and our ongoing testing regime, provide evidence of a story of phosphate pollution in Buntingford. It is clear to us that the River Rib is being highly polluted but then diluted by the Quin at Riversmeet. Interestingly our finding replicate those of the EA (Environment Agency) and

demonstrate one of the main reasons why the river classification for the River Rib, according to the Water Framework Directive and presented in the Chalk stream Restoration Strategy, is poor.

We will, of course, continue with our monthly monitoring of the sites in Buntingford, Braughing, Standon and Cold Christmas, and we have new sites

that we are looking at as well. It is good to see that this type of Citizen Science can back up the testing of agencies such as the EA. It also shows how important our testing is, as we will be using this data to challenge Thames Water (who run the STWs in our area). We note that there is a planning application to upgrade the STW in Buntingford, we hope that this will include adding phosphate stripping, and therefore, we hope to see an improvement in the river south of the STW and that phosphate levels will significantly reduce. This can only benefit the whole of the River Rib below Buntingford.

In the meantime, we had a lovely day at Braughing Fair and Wheelbarrow Race, again we had a stand right next to the Quin and were able to do a Riverfly Monitoring demonstration. As ever the children loved to see the "creepy crawlies" and we got chatting to many people about the river, what we are doing and why.

I am sure many PS News readers are members of HMWT (Herts and Middlesex Wildlife Trust) and were as thrilled as we were to see FORQ get a mention in the article on Chalk Streams, in their quarterly magazine, "Wildlife Matters". We were even more please to see that the River Rib featured at number 1 in their "Top 5 places to see Chalk Streams".

Earlier this year, Peter Sinclair completed his 'survey' of the River Rib by walking along its banks from Braughing to the River Lea in Hertford. The previous year he walked the Rib from Therfield to Braughing and the Quin

from Barkway to its junction with the Rib at Riversmeet, Braughing. During his walks he surveyed the state of the rivers, which were often dry upstream. Sometimes the only water entering the rivers was from outflows from sewage treatment works.

He also noted the many landmarks, historical buildings and bridges along the rivers, as well as comments made by previous Hertfordshire 'surveyors' in the 1880s. His photographs enliven the text, which tells the fascinating story of our two chalk rivers. Sadly, not only are they under serious threat from abstraction and pollution, but also less than 10% of their lengths are accessible for the enjoyment of the general public.



# From the Rector

Dear Friends.

It is the wedding season! Probably the people happiest for our growing drought are those getting married. This year the "big day" seems to be always blessed by sunny skies and dry weather. It is always a joy for me to officiate at weddings, to see the couple wed and leave the church to a flurry of confetti. It is also a joy to attend weddings that are not in church, as I have done this summer, to see the happy couple. However, this started me thinking about why people choose one over the other, and perhaps to dispel some myths.

"Church weddings are more expensive". A number of people have told me that they think that a church wedding is more expensive. By and large, this is not true. The cost is broadly similar to a registry office. If the couple would like the choir and the bells, the cost will go up a little, but it is still relatively minor compared to the cost of the reception afterwards.

"I am not allowed to be married in church". There is a belief around that only people who go to church can be married in the Anglican Church. That is absolutely not true. Exactly which Anglican Church you are entitled to be married in depends on where you live and a number of other factors. If you are unsure about whether you can be married in one of our parish churches please feel free to contact me!

"I have to believe in God to be married in church". Well, the answer to this is "yes" and "no". The couple are married in the sight of God, will make their promises in the name of God, there will be prayers and a reading from the Bible. However nowhere do the couple have to state their commitment to Jesus, agree to come to church in the future or be baptised. It is Nonetheless, if you want to get quite possible, for example, for a Jew to be married in church, or someone with (let us say) vague spiritual beliefs in God. It is simply a conscience matter for the couple. I would never want to encourage hypocrisy, but nor is anyone going to interrogate you about what you believe.


There are also advantages (as well as disadvantages) about being married in

church. The churches in our benefice have splendid architecture, lots of space, are perfect for photography, have good (or great) organs for entrance and exit. In short, the couple get a beautiful backdrop for the wedding. They also get a weight of tradition that cannot be present in a civil ceremony. On the other hand, the civil ceremony is usually beautifully done (we have a registrar in or church family who has given me a lot of information about the civil side of marriage). Increasingly it can be at a variety of venues that the couple may prefer. Often it is at the site of the reception which means there is less need for moving around.

One pleasurable autumn task is the harvesting of ripened fruits from trees in your own garden. For most of us, our cooking apple will be a Bramley's Seedling and the dessert apple an Essexbred Discovery or a Cox's Orange Pippin. Originating from central Asia, apples are incredibly varied with at least 2,000 named varieties! There are 150 named varieties in the gardens at Audley End.

In the 19th century the skilled horticulturalists at the Rivers Nursery at Sawbridgeworth bred and propagated many varieties of fruit trees, including the prolific Czar plum and Conference pear, both of which are still available today. The Conference pear features in Great Chesterford's 21st-century community orchard.

For commercial reasons, the range available from modern plant nurseries is limited to a few easy-to-grow varieties. However, hidden away in forgotten corners of long-established gardens within the Hundred Parishes there will be specimens of heritage varieties of orchard trees. If you have a flavoursome, but unidentified, variety, then the team at the East of England Apples and Orchards Project would be delighted to hear from you.

British Sign Language (BSL) users can communicate more easily with the emergency services following the launch of a new service this month.



# Beware Rogue Traders offering Guttering and Chimney work

Increasing reports of rogue traders for roof guttering and chimney work
Trading Standards is seeing an increase in doorstep rogue trading complaints, especially roof, guttering and chimney work.

Rogue traders contact you in many ways: They cold-call or post a leaflet through the door or they respond to a job posted on a trader matching website. It even happens if you use a 'trusted trader' website where full checks haven't been done to spot the rogues; we are seeing more complaints about this last scenario.

Problems start when a small job turns into a bigger one eg. a quote for replacing loose tiles becomes a whole roofing job. Don't feel obliged to use the same trader, even if it seems to make sense while they are up on the roof. Get another trader to confirm if the work is actually needed and a reasonable price for it. Alarm bells should ring if an expensive quote is quickly reduced on condition the work is carried out straightaway. Beware if a trader claims a job is urgent and pressures you to agree.

Another warning sign is a lack of paperwork before work starts—look for full information (trader name, address, contact details, company status, full description of work and materials to be used, cost including whether VAT is included, how long the job will take, and proper cancellation rights given at the right time).

Our advice is: Never buy goods or services at the door. Use personal recommendations from friends or family to find a good trader - ensure they are from people you know, not just a local neighbourhood group. Or find a trustworthy, local trader at www.hertfordshire.gov.uk/goodtrader or call 01707 292429.

For advice or for help from Trading Standards call the Citizens Advice Consumer helpline on 0808 223 1133. Report frauds to police via ActionFraud on 0300 123 2040. Call police on 999 if a trader is aggressive or starts work without your agreement. Please look out for vulnerable neighbours and report concerns to us.



# *Warning as residents receive scam police calls*

Fraudsters posing as police officers have been contacting residents in Hertfordshire. Older residents, including those living in retirement villages, have particularly been targeted. Please share this alert with your older relatives and friends: this crime has a devastating effect on people so we need to raise awareness to prevent more people becoming victims.

The scams usually start with a phone call. The caller claims to be a police officer and tells you there is fraudulent activity on your bank account. You are then asked to put their bank cards and/or money into an envelope and give them to a courier or taxi driver, who is sent to your home by the caller. In some cases victims are asked to buy goods or vouchers.

The phoney police officer may also ask for your bank details, such as your account and PIN numbers, as part of their "investigation". This is a scam.

If you receive an unexpected call, you should be suspicious. It is vital to remember that your bank and the police would:

NEVER ask for your bank account details or PIN number over the phone. Do not disclose these to anyone, no matter who they claim to be.

NEVER ask you to withdraw money or purchase items and send it to them via a courier or by any other means. NEVER ask you to send your bank cards or any other personal property via courier or by any other means.

#### If you are suspicious of a caller, please end the call.

Remember, when reporting a suspicious phone call to police, use another phone or test your line first by phoning a friend or relative. to ensure you aren't still unwittingly connected to the fraudster. In an emergency or if a crime is in progress call 999.

If you have concerns about your bank account, visit your local branch.

Some phone companies offer

call screening services to help block marketing cold calls and bogus callers.





# Trees Cry for HELP!!!

Did you know trees communicate with each other?

Fine hair-like root fibres are the communication system (bit like our Fibre-Optics)

If there is a drought, the older trees will communicate to other mature trees to shed some leaves so they need less water. This means the younger trees have a far better chance of survival. When trees are under 'attack' from caterpillars/bugs they let others know and again can drop leaves to reduce damage, and regrow after the attack.

Trees are fundamental within Wildlife Corridors (where birds, mammals, bees etc. move around without fear).

So I would ask you to really think carefully before felling a tree. Well thought through pruning/tree-surgery means you are doing your bit for the environment and air quality.

Subsidence/heave in foundations is rare and selective pruning can easily keep this in check.
