Sustainability or Drive to Survive?

'Sustainability' came into widespread use after the 1992 Rio Earth Summit. The 2007 East Herts Local Plan could not be clearer (1.15.2) "Sustainability has become the new focus for planning." The same Plan stated (2.7) "Traffic and Traffic Reduction: Reduce the need to travel and if there is a need to travel, travel the shortest distance possible by the most efficient means possible." Herts County Council were even clearer; HCC Structure Plan Review 1998 stated "The need to travel will be reduced, mainly by locating and planning development so as to require fewer and shorter journeys"

The result in Standon Parish has been that the 1251 households in 1991 have been increased by 471 new dwellings to 2019. That's 37% increase whilst employment sites have been lost. Now bear in mind "Reduce the Need to Travel" - remember that Standon's railway station was closed in 1964 and the parish is further away from railway stations (Bishops Stortford 7.5m, Ware 8.5m, Stevenage 18.6m, Royston 16.1m) than anywhere else in Hertfordshire. Bus transport to a place of work is barely viable and social life requires a car journey. Without public transport new housing in Standon requires MORE and LONGER journeys to be made, contrary to policy.

And Sustainability? East Herts latest Local Plan 2018 has the same policy, but

now describes Standon & Puckeridge as one of "the most SUSTAINABLE villages in the District." (Villages 10.3.2) (My capitals). Surely this is the Standon & Puckeridge of 100 years ago - virtually self-sustaining with shops, pubs and numerous tradesmen, not the dormitory village of today. Surprise, surprise the Plan suggests a minimum of 10% increase in Standon Parish new housing to 2033 - 146 at least and 123of these have already been approved and built. The need for new housing is huge, especially for young and local people, but to locate it in villages without public transport and to call it Sustainable is wrong. Words need to mean something.

'Newspeak' in Orwell's book '1984' is defined by the Oxford English Dictionary as 'Ambiguous euphemistic language used chiefly in political propaganda.' What do you think of the Council's use of the word 'Sustainable'?

In autumn 2022, following a couple of emails to the Parish Council, their request to BT's adopt a phone box initiative and I am told the phone box has been refurbished for our community library.

Right, better get organised then! My mind was swimming with what was needed, how it would work and how I'd get this up and running. I was delighted to find it had a fresh lick of paint, windows and a book shelf installed. Someone had even and left a load of books on the shelves. I established a Facebook page (please join us at Puckeridge Little Library); feel free to donate or borrow a book or two, please no large donations, and we invite children to leave book related pictures or notes on the blank wall.

I pop down a couple of times a week to check in, tidy up and see the drawings and notes left by children. The drawings bring me a lot of joy, as well as how many people have stopped to ask about the library and almost always leave with a smile and a book. Who knew a square metre could do so much.

I am so pleased we have managed to turn a small corner of our village from a rundown and sad looking telephone box into a small but thriving community library. Do pop down and bring or take a book or two.

Patient Participation Group **Buntingford and Puckeridge Medical** Practice

There are currently 19,969 patients registered with the practice and in November, 9812 face to face appointments were carried out, 5797 of which were same day appointments. A further 3088 telephone consultations were held and a total of 10,164 telephone calls were managed by the Reception Teams. On average, that equates to 490 face to face to face appointments, 150 telephone consultations and over 500 telephone calls to the practice each working day. To say that the practice is very, very busy and working under huge pressure is to put it mildly. Much of the current demand is due to seasonal issues which have been compounded by media generated anxiety regarding issues such as Strep A in children. Please be assured that staff are working their socks off to manage and respond to patients. Please be patient if you are held on the phone, the team will get to you. The practice has been fortunate to have been able to continue recruiting new doctors, admin and nursing staff, with more to come.

The question of appointment availability and access was discussed at some length in the group. Local social media platforms Please ensure that the practice has an up have carried a few disgruntled comments but, overall, the public mood is positive albeit somewhat frustrated at the length of time that some calls are taken to answer. Perhaps, with greater understanding of the volume of calls being dealt with patients will understand the impact on the waiting time for calls to be answered. Patients can assist by calling after 11am to discuss routine and non-urgent appointments. Could the pharmacist help? They are available to give professional advice on a wide range of issues.

The practice would like to thank everyone who has signed up to order their medication electronically. They have been pleasantly surprised by the numbers now using this method of reordering prescriptions. It really helps to streamline the system and avoids the risk of paper requests going astray. If you have any concerns with signing up and getting started, please contact the surgery who have a team member that can assist with the set-up.

Annual chronic disease and long term conditions management is on track and has been maintained alongside the volume of acute needs. The latest newsletter is now available on the practice website.

Finally, except for some snagging and external landscaping, the Puckeridge building works are complete. The site is now fully open and functional and it is good to have the physiotherapist and mental health practitioner back on site. Discussions regarding the Buntingford site are ongoing.



Big Braughing Bird Count!

Members of Braughing Birding Group spent "Twixmas" (from Christmas Eve to New Year's Eve) seeing how many species of bird we could find in Braughing Parish. The habitat is not that varied: mainly gardens, farmland, a few small areas of woodland and a river.

We expected maybe 40 species (given only resident birds and winter visitors are around at this time of year). We were therefore staggered to record 63 species of bird and 12 mammal species.

Our most unusual bird was probably a Brambling, but along with the commoner species we also recorded Golden Plover, Corn Bunting, Grey Partridge, Grey Wagtail and Ring-necked Parakeets. Rare birds (for Braughing!!) included Canada Geese and Coot. We had very good numbers of winter thrushes (Fieldfare and Redwing), a singing Chiffchaff, lots of Yellowhammer & Linnet, some Goldcrest (our smallest British bird) and a few Bullfinch. We found 4 raptors: Kestrel, Sparrowhawk, Buzzard & Red Kite, and 2 owl species - Tawny and Barn. There must be a Little Owl somewhere in the Parish!

We didn't see several other birds we know are around: Kingfisher,

true number is probably closer to 70. We intend to repeat the count in late spring. The mammals consisted of 3 deer species: Fallow, Roe & Muntjac, plus Badger, Fox, Hare, Rabbit, Stoat, Grey Squirrel, Mole, Field Mouse & Brown Rat!

As we head into spring look out for the arrival of our summer visitors and passage migrants - birds that stop off for a day or two on their way north. Most years we get Wheatear & Stonechat and if we are lucky Whinchat, Redstart and Ring dances, some of which are virtually the Ouzel could turn up. It's always worth looking out for a passing Osprey overhead – we know they use features like main roads, rivers and railway lines to navigate and also the A10!


The two sides are learning each other's same but also different ones which adds variety to our repertoire will be better both for us and also for people watching.

Braughing Parish Council -*General Undate*

New Councillor Update

We are very fortunate to have been able to Co-opt John Dresner onto Braughing Parish Council at the January meeting

Precept

The Council voted to raise the precept by 5%. It has not been increased since 2018. For a Band D property this adds around £3 per year and reflects the increased cost to the Parish Council

Community Centre

BPC has agreed a grant to the Community Centre to add cladding to the front and side of the building to improve its appearance. Work has already begun.

Pentlows Meadow

The Parish Council has agreed to fund a Design Statement regarding upgrading of the Quin and creation of a Water Meadow and wetland. We will be seeking grants to help fund this. Sarah Perry (Herts & Middlesex Wildlife Trust) is supporting the Parish Council through this. BPC will hold an information morning on 1 April from 10-12 in the Old Boys School to share our aspirations with the village and discuss what facilities we should include.

Coronation

The Parish Council and St Mary's PCC plan to screen the Coronation of King Charles III in the Church and residents will be invited to dress up and come along. This will be followed by suitable refreshments.

Planning

The Parish Council maintains a Planning Log on the Braughing website. BPC has formally objected to 2 applications: Land at Green End (3/22/2533/FUL) and Field West of Dassels (3/22/2431/OUT) - this has recently been refused. Other recent decisions: - Methodist Church (3/22/0995/ FUL) granted with conditions; Land at Quinbury (3/22/0813/FUL) refused; Land North of Maltings Lane (3/22/0813/FUL) granted with Conditions. Residents are all encouraged to check that what is being built around the village (new builds and extensions) is actually what was agreed by the planning authorities. Residents are also reminded that they can object as individuals to any planning application in the Village. Go to the "Planning & Building" page on EHDC website (please copy the Parish Council in).

Highways

BPC continues to receive more correspondence regarding Highways issues than anything else. As a Parish Council there is very little we can do about most of these concerns other than raise them with Jeff Jones our County Councillor. We have created a Highways Log to enable us to keep track of these issues and keep up the pressure on the County Council to rectify the problems. Meanwhile everyone can report an issue directly to HCC via their highways portal (please copy the Parish Council in if you do). Highways have asked for all potholes to be reported following the recent cold weather

Climate Change and Ecological **Emergency:**

Friends of the Rib and Ouin (FORO)

Life is quite quiet at this time of year for most FORQ members. Due to their closeness to some trout redds (breading grounds) we are not able to do Riverfly Monitoring (RFM) at local sites. This is the recommendation from HMWT (Herts and Middlesex Wildlife Trust). Monitoring will restart in March.

Local historian and writer Kathryn Shreeve has been with FORO since it started. Kathryn has published several books on the Puckeridge area through the ages. Her latest book "Life Along the River" tells the story of our river valleys through history. It is being serialised into 10 chapters, all of which are available on the FORQ website, History section.

Many will be aware of the proposals and current hybrid planning application for 1800 homes to the north of Ware. FORQ are concerned that current water infrastructure (both in terms of supply and waste management) cannot support such a development.

Thames Water has identified an inability of the existing FOUL WATER network infrastructure to accommodate the needs of this development. Thames Water has contacted the developer in an attempt to agree a position for foul water networks and requested that a number of conditions be added to any planning permission.

There is more information on this on the FORQ website, along with links to the associated documents. We have written to Sir Oliver Heald, Member of Parliament for our constituency and catchment as well as FORQ's President, for some advice.

Our work documenting the pollution and abstraction impacting our two chalk streams has raised clear and obvious questions, and we sought his suggestions as to how we might best receive answers from the water companies and local planning authorities. A copy of the letter is available to download on our website.

The letter was copied to our local councillors, the parish councils and angling interests that we have met and gained the support of over recent months.

Sir Oliver was good enough to immediately write to Therese Coffey, the new Secretary of State for Defra, raising our concerns. Jan Goodeve, East Herts District Council Executive Member for Planning & Economic Growth also responded and shared it with appropriate EHDC planning officers.

Unfortunately it wasn't until early January that Sir Oliver was able to reply to us. He sent on the letter he had received from Rebecca Pow MP. Defra Minister for Environmental Quality and Resilience (a copy is on the FORQ website).

At the end of January the Government published its

Environment Improvement Plan 2023. Link on the FORQ website, with details from the section that concentrates on the plan relating to water. The plan says "We will achieve clean and plentiful water by improving at least 75% of our waters to be close to their natural state as soon as is practicable."

The plan lists a number of targets and how the government aims to meet them.

Importantly the plan says that the government will "Protect our chalk streams by supporting the Chalk Stream Strategy".

As many readers know FORQ monitor sewage spills into our rivers. We therefore were keen to look at Thames Water's recently launched new website that reports when raw sewage is entering rivers from facilities they operate. The site uses the same data that has been historically published by the Rivers Trust on an annual basis, but has now made this available in real time.

Not all sewage treatment sites are included, but casual monitoring since its launch has shown a number of spills already in our catchment. Details and a link to the Thames Water site are on the FORO website.





So, what even is the pelvic floor and what is pelvic health physiotherapy?

We've all heard of the term pelvic floor a lot, I'm sure as women we have all been told that we need to do our pelvic floor exercises. But what even is the pelvic floor and why is it important?

The pelvic floor is a group of muscles that sit like a hammock in the bottom of the pelvis. It controls our bladder and bowel function, supports our pelvic organs (bladder, rectum and uterus) allowing sexual function, core stability and circulation of blood through the pelvis.

Pelvic health is a highly specialised area of physiotherapy which requires post-graduate training.

What is a Mummy MOT?

A Mummy MOT is a specialist postnatal assessment following both vaginal and C-section deliveries.

It is a 1-hour assessment focussed on you and your body; and includes:

- Full postural screen
- Pelvic floor muscle assessment. The best method for assessing the pelvic floor is via a vaginal internal examination.
- Abdominal muscle exam to check for any separation
- Screening for bladder, bowel, or sexual dysfunction

You will come away with a full written report of findings from your assessment alongside a bespoke rehabilitation program with your goals at the forefront.

Why is it important?

Post pregnancy and birth your body has been through a lot! Unfortunately, it is common for women to believe symptoms such as pain, incontinence (including any leaking!) is normal and part of being a woman.

Half of all women have weakness post birth, whether that affects your tummy muscles, your pelvic floor, your back and buttock muscles or all! It is important that we rehabilitate these issues just like any other injury and help prevent long-term childbirth related complaints.

Who is The Mummy MOT for?

It is recommended for all postnatal women! We recommend the earliest you book in for your Mummy MOT is 6-8 weeks and after your GP check-up. You can still have this specialist assessment even years post birth. It is never too late!

Stansted Airport Community Fund

As part of the wider agreement which gave Stansted Airport permission to handle up to 43 million passengers a year, the airport has an obligation to pay a minimum of £150,000 each year for the next 10 years in grants for local good causes. Local is defined as being within 10 miles of the Stansted runway.

The annual sum available for grants will increase in line with inflation (CPI) and the fund will also receive all the income from fines imposed on airlines when noise regulations are breached. This could amount to a further £10,000 to £20,000 per annum.

Some will take the view that all of this is small consolation for the additional noise and other negative aspects of airport expansion. However, many local organisations will have an opportunity to benefit and it's important that they should know more about the fund.

The fund will make one major award each year of $\pounds 50,000$ and the remaining $\pounds 100,000+$ will be available for community grants of up to $\pounds 5,000$ each. Parish councils, local charities and other not-for-profit organisations are all eligible to apply.

Applications are now being invited for the annual 'Flagship Award' of £50,000. Inevitably this will be extremely competitive and there can only be one successful applicant each year. The deadline for this year's 'Flagship Award' applications closes on 21 April. The Fund Committee will consider the applications in early May and the successful applicant will be notified shortly afterwards.

Applications are also now being invited for Community Grants of up to £5,000. The closing date for the first round of applications is 3 March and the intention is to have four funding rounds each year, i.e., approximately every three months. The first round of Community Grant applications will be considered by the Fund Committee on 23 March and successful applicants will be notified shortly afterwards.

Examples of applications which could be eligible for funding are:

- Projects which would help/support voluntary youth groups, the elderly or disabled.
- Projects which support community life such as improvements to village halls.
- New and/or improved facilities which would be of benefit to local communities.
- Projects that support community arts and/or sporting/leisure activities.
- Environmental/conservation schemes supporting access to the countryside/ outdoors.

Swifts, or Apus Apus, so good they named them twice.

With spring just around the corner my thoughts are turning to summer visitors. The 'tourists' I am thinking about are the migrating birds that will soon be returning to our area to breed after spending the winter in warmer climes. And of all the species my personal favourite is the swift, those black-looking, scythe-shaped, aerial masters who arrive back here in May. Who does not love to see a scream of swifts tearing around the rooftops?

Actually sooty brown with a white throat, they are the fastest birds in level flight with a top speed of nearly 70mph. Sleeping, eating, bathing and even mating on the wing, it is likely that many of the swifts won't have stopped flying since they left the nest the previous year. An individual swift can fly as many as four million miles in its lifetime.

On their return swifts have one thing on their minds - to mate. Swifts pair for life, returning to the same site each year for a little nest renovation before laying and incubating their eggs. They like to live in houses and churches, squeezing through tiny gaps to nest inside roofs. But as more old buildings are renovated and gaps in soffits closed up, swift nest sites are fast disappearing. This combined with other factors such as the increased use of pesticides, reducing their insect prey, has led to their decline; swifts have roughly halved in numbers over the last twenty years in the UK.

However, all is not lost as swifts will readily adopt nest boxes that have been specifically designed for them. It may take a little while for them to find the boxes, but this is a really useful way of helping these birds. Wouldn't it be wonderful if we could get the numbers of these 'devil's birds' back to where they were twenty years ago in Puckeridge and Standon?

As a first step, I hope that by the summer there will be swift boxes installed at St Mary's Church. Gavin Vicary of North East Herts Swift Group has obtained the necessary permission and will make two boxes, each with nine nest holes, to fit behind the louvres of the bell tower. But we don't need to stop there as smaller boxes are highly suitable for fitting to houses. The best places are under deep eaves, on gables or on high walls in some shade; they need to be at least 4.5 metres above ground. They must not be subject to disturbance from window cleaning or maintenance visits and safe from potential attack by squirrels, magpies and crows, so no adjacent branches or creepers. Finally, there must be uncluttered adjacent airspace for easy flight access. It is worth knowing that, unlike swallows and house martins, swifts are clean birds. The adults eat most of the chicks' droppings (possibly to recycle the mineral content) so there are no great piles of mess beneath the nest.

The Swift Conservation website has information on many different nest boxes

that are available to purchase, information on how to make your own and more advice on where to site them. However, for those like me who are not so DIYminded, help is available from Clive Fleming of the Hertford Swift Group. He can provide locally produced swift boxes at about £25 each and also arrange installation. The cost of installation depends on the number of boxes to be fitted in an area and would be between £10 and £35; the more fitted in one visit the cheaper the price. Clive is always looking for more people to make the boxes; instructions and advice would be provided. If you would like to help in this way, do get in touch with me

I should like to remind everyone that they will need photographic identification to vote in the District Council elections on 4 May 2023. The main authorised documents are a driving licence, a passport, a bus pass, a Blue Badge (disabled parking permit) or an identity card bearing the Proof of Age Standards Scheme hologram (PASS card).

If you don't have authorised photographic identity document, you can apply for a Voter Authority Certificate. This is completely free. Go to voter-authoritycertificate.service.gov.uk, or you can ask for a paper form from East Herts District Council by ringing electoral services on 01279 655261. You must apply by 5pm on 25 April 2023. For further information, go to <u>https://www.eastherts.gov.uk/</u> <u>elections-and-voting/voter-id</u>.

The Labour Party opposed the introduction of this requirement, because it is likely to result in many people being turned away from the polling station, in spite of the fact that there is no evidence of widespread fraud in the voting system as it was. However, Parliament decided to go ahead with it.

In the last edition of PS News, I outlined the changes in district wards. In brief: Standon, Puckeridge, Braughing, Old Hall Green, Wellpond Green and Colliers End are now in a new ward of Braughing & Standon, with two councillors; Nasty and the Mundens are in a revised ward of The Mundens (one councillor); Little Hadham is in Little Hadham and the Pelhams (one councillor); and High Cross and Standon Green End are in the new ward of Ware Rural (one councillor).

Tales from Brockholds Manor

We Are Making a Woodland Garden Many of you will know that when we moved to Brockholds Manor, there really wasn't anything you could call a garden. There were however some trees, planted all the way along the North boundary set out in rows as neatly planted as could be. We assume they were planted as a much needed wind break. We think Brockholds is a lovely spot and well-chosen by Sir Geoffrey de Brockholes who first lived here, as it does not get the frosts that the surrounding land gets.

When we first saw 'The Wood', it did not look very inspiring. Richard decided the first thing to do was to raise the canopy, He set to work and removed all the lower branches up a height of about 7ft. I had been sceptical and was amazed at the aesthetic improvement. I imagined just how gorgeous the area could look carpeted with spring flowers.

I was desperate to plant something that first Autumn but had not even started to design the garden. I thought a few bulbs planted in the, would be, woodland was a safe place to start as it would not affect the rest of the garden. The reality was quite different from the dream, the soil was rock hard and very dry, and years of stripping away the leaves had left the soil denuded of everything a plant needs. We finally managed to dig in some composts and pop in the bulbs.

Needless to say, when the leaves dropped that first autumn and since, we left them on the ground. We have planted Snowdrops, Bluebells, Crocus, Cyclamen and the fabulous Helleborus foetidus, with its lime green flowers which are at their best in February and March. We have this growing next to our gravel drive, it self-seeds into the gravel and we rescue the seedlings and plant them in the woodland.

Over the years we have had to remove dangerous trees and some leylandii

hedges, which really is a plant that should come with a warning. These have then been chipped and we have spent many an afternoon and evening barrowing the wood chippings around the woods to make paths. As the Bluebells die down the woodland becomes covered in frothy billowing Cow Parsley, which was planted by Mother Nature and is when the woods are at their most beautiful.

There is one job which is endless and that my father undertakes. This is the task of removing all the branches large and small which fall either on the paths on were the planting is. Like much of gardening it is all about editing or choosing just what can stay and what is best removed. After any strong winds there are usually a few barrow loads to be collected.

There is a central path that runs the whole length of the trees and others which branch off from it and meander around the rows of trees. If I had been trying to create a woodland from scratch, I would never have planted the trees in rows but it has turned out to be a stroke of genius, which I am truly thankful for and which we now know was carried out in the late 1980s not the 1950s. The shadows and patterns created by the symmetry of the tress are simply stunning especially at sunrise and sunset.

Although the area is not large enough to be called a woodland, we are starting to think of it as our little woodland and feel so lucky to be able to enjoy this little spot of heaven.
