Goodbye from the Rector Dear Friends,

With great sadness, I have to say that this will be my last article. After a very happy six and a half years in the Benefice, Basma and I will be moving on to retirement. It is a great wrench; we have enjoyed being here immensely and have made many friends. The churches have been a constant source of encouragement and joy and the Hertfordshire villages' balm to the soul.

It has been a fascinating time to have the privilege to minister here. After a year of "settling in" there was covid, which brought new challenges of having to operate online and see people only in the open air. We soon discovered that two dog-lead lengths was about the correct distance to separate, which meant walking the dog was even more enjoyable!

After covid we (like everyone) did all we could to get back to normal, and our churches have done that. Since then we have seen new people come to Jesus, our services consolidated and our buildings repaired. There have been new things started, like Little Angels in Standon, some such as the Cafe in Little Munden have flourished, and some things have stopped that were no longer working.

For us personally the last two years have been dominated by the genocide in Gaza, including the killing of some of Basma's relatives. We have been very grateful for the support of so many who have comforted and tried to understand, and who have been prepared to question previously held ideas.

Of course, our main preoccupation has been for people to know more of Jesus and to worship him as Lord and Saviour. In the last two years or so, we have seen people asking question along the lines of, "What's it all about?" This is particularly true of Gen Z who, unlike my generation, have nothing like the hope in

Friends of the Rib & Quin

After five years as a community organisation, Friends of the Rib and Quin (FORQ) is reshaping itself into a less formal entity. Some activities continue, such as Riverfly monitoring and working with local schools.

Our objectives in setting up FORQ were three-fold:

- to raise awareness of the special nature our two local chalk streams and the challenges they face;
- to benchmark the wildlife in our catchment area, both in and out of the rivers, and
- to campaign for remedies to the problems of pollution and abstraction of the aquifer that significantly impact our chalk streams.

The FORQ Executive believe we have achieved some successes, locally more people know of our chalk streams, their rarity and their ecological importance. The number of Riverfly monitoring surveys now totals three figures and nearly 1000 different species have been identified in our catchment through our iNaturalist Community recording scheme.

Despite this, our local chalk streams are officially classed as being in a "poor ecological condition" and this will not improve until solutions to the challenges of pollution and abstraction to this country's rivers are addressed.

This change gives us the opportunity to disperse our remaining funds. We will be donating to Barley & Barkway First Schools Federation, Roger de Clare First School and 1st Braughing Scout Group. We think this appropriate in the context of the work they do in introducing their young people to our local chalk streams and their biodiversity. We take this opportunity to thank those who have supported us. Our personal thanks to all of you.





As a result, we should have a bumper harvest this year. We will start harvesting in August which because of the hot weather is several weeks earlier than usual. We will start to make our cider in September.

As you can see from our photograph, the vines are looking really healthy. We have cut the grass between the rows, bud rubbed the vine trunks, taken out the lateral growth and trimmed the tops of the vines. The vineyard looks amazing. Unfortunately, we have a massive

problem - NO GRAPES. On 20 May we had a very late frost. This burnt all the new growth on the vines. Consequently, we will get so few grapes it will be unlikely that we will have a harvest. The vines are growing new bunches of grapes but there isn't enough time for them to mature and ripen.

There is absolutely no point in getting disheartened - "onward and upwards". Let's look forward to Summer 2026. Farming is not easy!!





Don't be pressured into making quick decisions—fraudsters often create a sense of urgency.

4. Use Strong Passwords

Create unique, complex passwords for each account.

Use two-factor authentication (2FA) wherever possible.

5. Monitor Your Accounts

Regularly check bank statements and online accounts for unusual activity.

Report suspicious transactions immediately.

6. Stay Informed

Keep up to date with common scams in your area.

Follow trusted sources like Action Fraud (UK), or your local police.

7. Secure Your Devices

Install antivirus software and keep your devices updated.

Avoid using public Wi-Fi for financial transactions.

8. Report Fraud

If you suspect fraud, report it to the relevant authorities or fraud prevention services.

In the UK, contact Action Fraud.

E-Scooter Awareness – Know the Law!

Thinking of riding your privately owned e-scooter on public roads or pavements? Think again.

As of 2025, privately owned escooters remain illegal to use on public roads, pavements, and cycle lanes. They can only be used on private land with permission.

Why? Because under UK law, escooters are classed as motor vehicles. That means they must:

- Be insured
- Be registered with the DVLA
- Have an MOT and road tax
- Meet strict construction and lighting standards

Most private e-scooters don't meet these requirements, making them illegal to use in public spaces.

Using one illegally could result in:

- A £300 fine
- 6 penalty points on your driving licence
- Your e-scooter being seized
- Rental e-scooters are only legal in designated trial areas and must follow strict rules, including age and licence requirements.

Anti-social Behaviour

ASB relates to a wide range of behaviours. It includes excess noise, vandalism, neighbour disputes, fly tipping and abandoned or nuisance vehicles. Members of the public should report ASB to the anti-social behaviour team at East Herts Council via the council's website, or report it directly to the police if they feel they are at immediate risk.

The Parish Council has received reports that residents are unhappy with horses on the highway. If you witness an incident please report it direct to the Police. Currently, the Police have not received any reports regarding horses and the public highway. Putting posts on social media will not result in Police action.

Allotments

The allotment year will commence on the 1 October to ensure that all vegetables and fruit can be harvested and the plot cleared ready for the next growing year. There are a number of vacant allotments, many of which need to be cleared. If you want to take on an allotment which needs to be cleared before you can cultivate it, you will be entitled to a significantly reduced rent in the first year. Please contact the Clerk for more details.

What is a Parish Council and why become a Parish Councillor?

What is a Parish Council?

A parish council is a local authority that makes decisions on behalf of the people in the parish and has an overall responsibility for the wellbeing of its local community. Parish councils are invariably the first place people will go with concerns or ideas and are a vital part of any community.

Its focus falls into three main categories:

• representing the local community

- delivering services to meet local needs
- striving to improve quality of life in the parish

Why become a Parish Councillor? By becoming a parish councillor you become someone your community will look to for help, guidance and support a community leader with the power to influence decisions for the benefit of the people you serve.

Seeing your community change for the better, because of decisions you have helped make, is something that can give you a sense of achievement.

What decisions do Parish Councils make?

Probably the most common topics that parish councils get involved with are planning matters (they are statutory consultees), crime prevention, helping local groups, managing community facilities and open spaces, and campaigning for and delivering better services and facilities.

While parish councils have limited powers to make decisions they have the ability to negotiate with, and the power to influence, other organisations that do make the final decisions (such as the borough or unitary council, health authorities, police etc).

In this respect parish councils are extremely powerful. The organisations that make the final decisions know that a parish council gives the best reflection of how a community feels about something, and its views will be taken seriously.

How much time does it take up? The parish council meets once a month. Meetings usually last for two hours, depending on the agenda - so it's not going to take over your life.

Am I eligible to be a Parish Councillor?

In brief you have to be a British

Braughing Parish Council

Following the APM, Cllr Ford was re-elected as Chair and Cllr Fleetwood as Vice-chair. Portfolios were reassigned among the councillors. BPC has reinstated the Public Correspondence Log.

BPC have initiated a dialogue with the landlord regarding renewal of the lease on the leased land (due in 2029) which contains the allotments, playground and Community Orchard

BPC thanked Peter Boylan for his work in cataloguing the Council's historical documentation, which was housed in the safe. It will now be handed to Hertfordshire Archives for safe-keeping.

Highways: once again there has been a lot of roadworks and resurfacing going on in the village. We are grateful to parishioners for their patience

Speed Indicator Device (SIDs) we received a request to fund the insurance on one of the SIDs in the village, previously this has been funded from our County Councillor budget. BPC decided not to fund this and we have asked our County Councillor to reconsider.

Planning: BPC renewed our objection to the construction of a property at Quinbury Farm, which has gone to the Secretary of State on appeal. BPC also objected to

access works on land east of Green End Farm and to the construction of three 5-bedded houses in Dassels.

Pentlows Meadow: We are hopeful the Environment Agency will grant permission shortly for the project. A contractor has been appointed and we hope the work will be carried out in October

Litter Bins: BPC are still actively pursuing EHDC for the removal of three of our litter bins including one owned by BPC. We have asked District Cllr Terry Smith to investigate on our behalf.

100th birthday celebration: BPC celebrated the 100th birthday of local resident Alec Webb (who has lived in Braughing for most of his life) by commissioning a picture for him.

This was painted by Jane Davalle and presented to Alec at a special celebratory coffee morning in May where prosecco and birthday cake were served.

Many thanks to Jane for doing the picture and to Tricia Lilley and Marion Saunders for providing the cake; also to the extra helpers on the day. More than double the usual number of residents attended the event.

The Pudding Stone should be installed shortly at its new site by the ford.

Peter Marshall 28.10.1933 - 26.7.2025



Prof Peter James Marshall CBE FBA (he would have hated me for using all his "titles") passed away on 26 July at the age of 91. Peter had lived in Maltings Cottages since 1969 with his successive cats: Toby, Biggles and Widget. Peter was a

very gentle, kind and unassuming man. Yet he was a highly respected historian and author.

Peter was born in Calcutta – he always said he was born in the zoo which would be possible as his family lived there (his father was the administrative secretary), however as he was born by caesarean he would have to have been delivered by the vet! Peter returned to England at the age of 2 as a sickly child, attended Boarding School and spent 2 years National Service as an officer in one of the Kenya Battalions of the King's African Rifles during the time of the Mau-Mau war. It was a time of great violence and suffering and not something he cared to remember although he always had a soft spot for the country of Kenya.

Peter attended Wadham College Oxford (where he later became Honorary Fellow) and completed a PhD. His book, based on his PhD, "The Impeachment of Warren Hastings" remains the classic study of the subject. Meanwhile Peter attained his "only academic job" at his first attempt at King's College London where he rose from Assistant Lecturer in 1959 to Professor of History in 1978. He was also elected to the Rhodes Fellowship in Imperial History from 1980 until he "retired" in 1993. Peter was the author of a number of academic works, the last, completed just before his death, will be published posthumously. He became President of the Royal Historic Society from 1996-2000. He endowed the RHS Marshall Fellowships supporting young researchers towards their PhD. In 2002, Peter was awarded the CBE for services to History.

Peter loved to travel. He made many visits back to India. His last trip was to St Vincent and the Grenadines where he completed research for his final book *Slave Ownership and Paternalist. Sir William Young (1749-1815) in England and the Caribbean.* Although into his 80's, he insisted on finding a local guide to take him up the mountain to see the St Vincent Parrot. The guide told Peter he was oldest person he'd ever taken there.


In Braughing we knew him as a man who loved his garden and shared that love with anyone and everyone (including the children at

He loved nature and particularly birds. He was a generous host: he loved to cook and to entertain. He loved Cheese and (very) good wine. He was a regular attender at St Mary's Church. He would chat to anyone and everyone, understanding their point of view but never judging them. He had a breadth of knowledge and an inquiring mind that meant he could talk to almost anyone about almost anything!

Peter was unique. God broke the mould after he created Peter. He had that remarkable quality of "niceness". He was gentle, modest, kind, in every way a gentleman and a genuinely lovely man. It was an honour to have known him. We will all miss him very much.

When you see a Right of Way changed, with no advance notices erected or your chance to question/oppose, then please do contact the Rights Of Way dept. at Herts County Council. It is illegal to change historic rights of way. They are part of our historic environment and a cultural joy.

Look after your garden

Each summer we are poised ready for the dreaded hosepipe ban. Lawns take one of the biggest hits but make the quickest recovery.

Unfortunately, the same cannot be said for plants/shrubs.

Alongside this, with our increasingly busy lives, weeding and stand around watering is not what we want to be doing.

My team and I deliver a solution to take the pressure off and is aesthetically pleasing.

The new planting schemes we put in now are most always DDM's =Disease (resistant)/Drought/ Maintenance ~as a design approach. Embracing plants that withstand of really low temperatures. We can take all these pressures away from you by planting the appropriate plants for your soil type and garden size and adding the best slow release feed. Then adding a proper membrane with an enhancing gravel/slate for no weeding and drought tolerance. We plant for all year round colour, some bee-friendly plants and ones that will grow to suit the space. We can embrace this in existing gardens with minimum disruption.

Think of the stress this will take away.

Having your own home or your place of solace is a blessing - and sometimes a curse.

As we know, homes need maintaining and the costs are just seemingly spiralling.

Come winter we get the storms/high winds and as we

have seen across the country, they can wreak devastating results.

Fences are one of the main things to take the hit. Breaking onto plants, falling into neighbours garden, sudden loss of security, let alone how awful it looks.

My team and I are often asked to put in hedging, the design is this: Put up a 6ft large square mesh fence and along it plant Pyracanthus. This plant if full of thorns ~ great for security. It soon climbs the mesh wire, fully covering it. It holds is leaves (privacy). It has blossom in Spring and bright berries in Autumn. Birds love it to sing /nest in, as Cats cannot get in it. In addition, butterflies/ caterpillars love it. Who doesn't love that sweet song of a Robin or Wren (I am always amazed at how so much volume can emit from such a tiny creature). The open mesh fencing also allows hedgehogs freedom which is so very important.

So there you have it .Screening, security, colour and no more painting (just a trim and tidy once a year) plus hedges do not succumb to storms and a great place for birdsong. Has to be a winner!

It is also well documented that hedges are true 'Wildlife corridors', allowing moths, beetles, shrews and birds to feel safe when out doing their daily existing in what is really our manicured environment. So you will be doing your bit for them.

Buying and selling tickets – your safety guide

We've all experienced that mixture of hopefulness and elation that comes with trying to get tickets to a must-see live event. But that promise of an unmissable moment can quickly turn sour if you fall victim to an online ticket scam from an unregulated site, on social media, a fan forum or auction platform.

Don't let your excitement lead to disappointment. Here's your checklist to safer buying online.

Use a regulated platform

Do your homework: Purchase tickets only through a legitimate and regulated platform. If you are unsure of a website's legitimacy, you can check it by using Get Safe Online's Check a Website tool.

Cover yourself: Ensure platforms offer fan protection with a guarantee should anything go wrong. Regulated ticket marketplaces such as viagogo offer a moneyback guarantee. Buyers are guaranteed to receive valid tickets in time for the event and if an issue arises, viagogo will step in to provide comparable replacement tickets or a refund.

Resist the hard sell and social media: Getting in-demand tickets can feel like a race against time but don't let individual sellers pressure you into a quick purchase. It's best to avoid buying tickets on social media where many sellers are unverified, increasing the risk of scams or counterfeit tickets. Plus, social media platforms often lack buyer protection, making it harder to get a refund if something does go wrong.

Choose 24/7 support: Buy tickets from a regulated site that offers 24/7 customer support to make sure help is always available if you experience issues, like trouble accessing your tickets. Round-the-clock support also

provides peace of mind, knowing you can quickly resolve any unexpected problems.

Verify the venue and date: If the event is taking place at a venue unknown to you, then confirm its existence through online maps and look for independent reviews. Once you have done so, search the original live event announcement or schedule on the artiste or team's website to make sure dates and location align.

Price check reality: If a deal seems too good to be true, it probably is. Avoid suspiciously cheap tickets.

Protect your information

Avoid transfers; pay with credit card: Unless you're dealing with a trusted or regulated platform, avoid bank transfers. Direct payment methods do not provide protection or allow you to track your order, they also limit your ability to recoup your money in the case of a scam. Credit cards offer better protection.

Stick to the platform: Don't share your contact details with anyone outside of the company you're purchasing tickets from and be wary of any sellers asking you to take the transaction off the platform. Any transactions that take place off the platform will not be protected, nor will any information you share.

Secure sites only: Make sure the website uses a secure connection (https) before entering payment details.

Don't display details: Visible bar codes, QR codes and order numbers can lead to your information, or the security of your ticket, being compromised. Protect your ticket, cover up any visible information.

Be vigilant

Save your receipts: Keep copies of all confirmations and payments.

Monitor your statements: Watch out for any unauthorised charges.

- · Secure number plates with antitheft screws.


