I am not a runner or a fitness person however, I entered the ballot for the London marathon 2025 as a joke with my partner and to my surprise, I actually got in! I decided I had to try my best to do this I couldn't let this go to waste, I also decided to use my place to run for a charity called child bereavement UK, I had no target but managed to raise £730 so far and still have people donating.

As a full time Nurse and in the process of many big life changes I didn't manage to train half as much as I'd have hoped. I went into the day just proud I had got to the start line, it was the hardest challenge in my life so far and I could not have done it without the amazing support of my partner, family and friends. Due to my back and having not trained a great deal I had a personal target of around 8 hours to complete it, I ended up crossing the finish line at 8 hours on the dot and had the medal placed round my neck which was the most amazing feeling in the world!

Who are we? Men and women from the local communities who get together to use existing skills, and learn new ones, to make and repair things There is no upper age requirement or specific skills needed but you must be over 18. We were originally part funded by Braughing Parish Council as part of its overall wellbeing strategy and we received a grant from East Herts District Council.

Where we do it? We meet on Wednesdays in a barn at Brook Cottage Farm Riding School, Furneux Pelham, SG9 0LL, from noon until 4pm, although you can come and go within these core hours as you please, to fit in with your life.

Our aim: We provide a venue for local people to help relieve feelings of isolation, create friendships and offer support while working on projects and share ideas with a cuppa and cake.

We make and repair items for sale, for charity, or to support residents or village community associations to build and mend items for themselves with help as required. We do this through up-cycling

using donated and reclaimed wood, pallets and other materials for projects. We may work with new materials as required. We sell the items we make in order to be self-funding whilst donating to local charities. We make hedgehog houses, bat boxes, bird tables, bird feeders, bug hotels, wooden storage crates, garden planters etc., or whatever you want to make.

What do you need? You do not need to have any specialist skills but if you have any, they would be welcomed or you can come along and learn new skills. You are free to make whatever you want. You can either work alone or team up with others. We use tools that belong to the club that have been kindly donated and members often bring their own tools for particular projects. The club will buy tools as and when required.

What does it cost? The club cost £2.00 a week to go towards materials, such as nails, screws and tools and refreshments.

Braughing Birdwatching Groun

The Braughing Birdwatching Group celebrated our 4th birthday in April. The Group was founded in Vic Flintham's garden back in 2021. The aim was to enjoy our local birds together and go on occasional outings further afield. We have around a dozen active members plus a number of others who follow our exploits on social media.

We decided we would have a birthday outing. After some issues with our original venue we decided to visit RSPB Minsmere. If you have never been, do try and go, it's a lovely reserve on the Suffolk coast with plenty to see at any time of year.

After weeks of sunshine, typically we arrived to overcast skies and a cool breeze. We began on Westleton Heath looking for Dartford Warblers but I think it was just too cold and they were



hunkered down. We did find a lovely Willow Warbler though.

On to the reserve proper and after a rejuvenating cup of coffee and cake we headed out for the scrapes. We stopped briefly by the Sand Martin bank: too cold for the adders but lots of Sand Martins and the occasional Swallow flitting about. Minsmere, like most of our reserves, is suffering from weeks of Northerly winds which has inhibited

wader migration however we found some Snipe hiding at North Hide.

On to East Hide for a wonderful array of ducks including Teal, Pintail, Gadwall, Mallard, Shoveler, and Shelduck along with our first waders: Black-tailed Godwits (looking gorgeous in their red summer plumage), a Ringed Plover and some Turnstones. The Avocets were putting on a show and we managed to find a Mediterranean Gull and a Caspian Gull among the commoner gull species.

We ventured onto the beach hoping for a migrant or two and maybe an adder but it was just too cold for anything apart from hardy Stonechats (although we had a lovely murmuration when flocks of around 50 Sandwich Terns and maybe 250 Godwits interweaved in a spectacular sky ballet).

South Hide produced good views of the Terns, a Redshank and a lone Knot while West hide gave us some Barnacle Geese.



From the Rector

Dear Friends.

8 May was Victory in Europe Day. It is a day that has particular resonance for me as I have photos of my father on VE Day in Hamburg, celebrating the war's end.

He was in the Army Film and Photographic unit, and took some stunning photographs of the war. Nonetheless these photos are slightly blurred, despite being taken by one of the professionals in the unit. There are many (looted?) empty champagne bottles around, which may have contributed to the blurring...

Perhaps we are a nation overly used to looking back for our triumphs and celebrations. It is now 80 years since that great day and there are very few participants still alive. We are now living largely from written records, not live memories.

So, what does victory look like today? Inevitably it is very different because we do not face the threat we faced in 1939. Or do we?

There are signs everywhere of the withering of the West, of the post WW2 settlement wearing thin and the rise of

other powers and influences. I am not competent to write about that (we will all have our opinions) but I can reflect on the nature of a different victory.

For the Christian some of the elements of VE are those to which we aspire: self-sacrifice, a higher duty and calling, a love for neighbour and (when we were at our best in WW2) a love for neighbour that transcended revenge. These are still values that I trust our churches (and villages) hold dear. But there is an even greater victory that was completed in defeat: the death of Jesus. There can be no doubt that the cross was, in any human terms, the most abject defeat.

Humiliation, abandonment and death are not the stuff of daring WW2 stories. Yet here was defeat but not failure. Ironically in the defeat came the greatest victory of all time. For through death came resurrection, and through resurrection came the defeat of death.

It is a victory beyond the dreams of VE day. It is an eternal victory that will never fail. After the celebrations of VE day, I recommend a little reflection on that still greater victory!

I'm moving and will be renting somewhere on my own for the first time. It feels like there's so much to think about, I'm worried I'll forget something important. Do you have any advice on what I should do when looking for a new home?

Most properties available for rent are listed online or with lettings agents.

If you have the chance, renting directly from a landlord might be a bit cheaper before you move in, as they may ask for fewer references and you might not need to do a credit check. But you'll have to deal with them directly if any issues arise during the tenancy. It's worth noting some landlords use a lettings agent to find their tenants and then manage the properties themselves. If an agent is managing the property then you'll deal with them rather than with the landlord directly, for instance, if you need to get any repairs done.

Beware rental fraudsters

Remember, never pay any money before you've seen the property as this is a common tactic used by rental fraudsters. If you can, take someone with you when viewing properties for a second opinion. If repairs are being done when you view a property, it's a good idea to take pictures of the issues and follow up after the viewing with an email so you've got a record of the issues and that you were told they'd be sorted before you move in.

Things often happen very quickly when trying to find somewhere to rent so always ask the landlord or letting agent some key questions to make sure properties you're considering are safe, affordable and meet your needs.

Key questions to ask include:

- How much is the rent? Is it payable monthly or weekly?
- How long is the tenancy?
- Are bills included in the rent?
- Are any appliances or furniture included?
- Is there a break clause allowing any fixed term to be ended early, if needed?
- Does the landlord need a guarantor?
- Is there a tenancy deposit, how much is it, and how will it be protected?

It's also good to ask whether the tenancy is for a self-contained property, or whether there are shared facilities, whether or not it's a joint tenancy with other people and, if relevant, if you can have pets. Make sure you're happy with the arrangements.

Holding deposit?

Check if you'll need to pay a holding deposit while the landlord carries out pretenancy checks. A deposit can't be more than a week's rent and should be returned to you at the start of the tenancy. You should also ask your landlord or letting agent what documents you'll need to provide when you agree to rent the property including evidence of your Right to Rent.

Avoid subletting

Avoid 'subletting' which is when you rent directly from an existing tenant, as they might not have the landlord's permission to rent to you, which could cause problems further down the line. If a tenant is showing you around the property on behalf of the landlord they should give you the landlord's contact details.

If a landlord refuses to rent to you because of who you are, this may be discrimination - for example because of your race, religion or sexual orientation. A 'no kids policy' or refusing to rent to you because you get benefits could also be discrimination. You only need to tell a landlord or letting agent you receive benefits if they ask.

Four Acres Vineyard, Little Hadham



It's Friday 25 April at 7am and I am out in the vineyard tying the canes onto the wires, the birds are singing and the occasional buzzard is calling in the distance. It is a glorious morning. There really is nothing more relaxing than

working in our one acre vineyard so early in the morning. The canes are supple this early in the morning and are easy to bend into the perfect position to tie onto the wires.

If the vines are not pruned they will grow up to thirty metres in length and produce very few grapes. People have been pruning vineyards for thousands of years. Once the vines start to grow our biggest problem is frost. So far we have been lucky but we have had frost in Little Hadham as late as 15 May. Let's hope our luck holds out this year. One year after a late frost the vines continued to grow but we did not get any grapes that year.

We built a barn in 2012 and with the help of an award winning winemaker we make our own rose and blanc de blancs sparkling wine. We also make cider from our own orchard here at Four Acres. We wanted to create a retirement hobby and we certainly succeeded!

We produce an average of 1500 bottles of sparkling wine per year, which we sell locally. Long may that continue.

We know that being outside is good for our wellbeing, both mental and physical. Besides the open countryside, we are fortunate in The Hundred Parishes to have parks and gardens where we can walk, sit and enjoy nature. I will mention just a few.

Bridge End Gardens in Saffron Walden was created by a local businessman and Quaker, Francis Gibson, in the 1840s. It is now managed by Saffron Waldon Town Council. Delights to explore include the hedge maze, rose garden and Dutch garden.

The Gardens of Easton Lodge in Little Easton have limited opening hours which can be found on our website www.hundredparishes.org.uk. They were designed by Harold Peto in 1902 for the Countess of Warwick who lived at Easton Lodge.

In Sawbridgeworth, Pishiobury Park was redesigned by Capability Brown in the 18th century as an enclosed park. It is a registered historic park and includes wet

woodland, grazed fields, an oak walk, meadows and part of the River Stort.

Birchanger Wood comprises 69 acres of ancient coppiced woodland, managed and owned by the Birchanger Wood Trust. Three miles of all-weather, wheelchair-friendly paths make it easy to explore.

In Stansted Mountfitchet, the Aubrey Buxton Nature Reserve is a 25 acre woodland with six man-made ponds. It was originally part of the park and garden of Aubrey Buxton's house. He was a co-founder of the World Wildlife Trust and donated the land to Essex Wildlife Trust. Today you can enjoy circular walks passing the ponds through the wood.

June is the month when many private gardens open to the public, even groups of gardens in Duxford and Ickleton – details appear on the What's On section of our website.

We hope you enjoy the summer and explore some of our wonderful parks and gardens.

Stay vigilant for ticket fraud ahead of top events and concerts this summer

campaign, warning people to be alert to fraudsters trying to catch out people planning for popular and sold-out events.

Follow our top tips to avoid falling victim to ticket fraud.

Only buy tickets from the venue's box office, official promoter or agent, or a well-known ticketing website.

Avoid paying for tickets by bank transfer, especially if buying from someone unknown. Credit card or payment services such as PayPal give you a better chance of recovering the money if you become a victim of fraud.

The password you use for your email account, as well as any other accounts you use to purchase tickets, should be different from all your other passwords. Use three random words to create a strong and memorable password, and enable 2-step verification (2SV).

Be wary of unsolicited emails, texts or adverts offering unbelievably good deals on tickets.

Is the vendor a member of STAR? If they are, the company has signed up to their strict governing standards. STAR also offers an approved Alternative Dispute Resolution service to help customers with outstanding complaints. For more information visit star.org.uk/buy_safe.

A barn is essential for a working farm, to store produce, tools and machinery and to house livestock. The Hundred Parishes has many fine examples of ancient barns which are still in use today, albeit sometimes for a purpose not envisaged when they were built. Some have been converted into homes while others have quite varied new uses.

In 1994, Thorley church purchased a dilapidated 16th-century barn which, following restoration, opened for community use as St Barnabas Centre. At Duddenhoe End, the thatched Hamlet Church started life as a barn.

Ashdon and Westmill (photo left)village halls both began life as barns in the 17th century.

Great Bardfield and Great Saling each have an ancient barn that has been



converted into a retail outlet with café, respectively The Blue Egg and Timbers.

In Chrishall, the Red Cow pub offers accommodation in the adjacent 500year-old thatched barn.

In Little Easton, the Countess of Warwick converted one of her barns into the Barn Theatre. It was used by many famous performers of the early 1900s and still occasionally serves that purpose, on other days being part of a tea room and events venue called Little Easton Manor.

In Great Bardfield, a Grade-I listed, 16th-century brick barn at Great Lodge now serves as the Anne of Cleves Barn wedding venue.

In Widdington, Grade I-listed Priors Hall Barn is a fine example of a medieval barn, dating from the 14th century and now owned by English Heritage. It is said that 400 oak trees were used in its construction. The large doors on either side could be opened for threshing, with the draught blowing the husks away from the grain. Priors Hall Barn is free to visit, open at weekends from April to September.
