Stansted Airport – Local Resident Discount Scheme

If you live within a 10-mile radius of Stansted Airport (e.g. in Puckeridge, Standon and Braughing) you can apply for Express Set Down Local Resident Discount Scheme, which reduces the charge as follows:

Residents living within 10 miles of the airport (e.g. Puckeridge, Standon and Braughing) pay £1.00 for up to 10 minutes.

Normal charges apply if you stay longer than 10 minutes, as does the £20.00 fee if you return within half an hour.

You can apply by completing the application form on their website search 'Stansted airport drop off resident discount scheme'

Bringing the curriculum alive at Roger de Clare!

Children love learning at Roger de Clare! Staff have worked hard to use the expectations of the EYFS Framework and the National Curriculum alongside our local context to build an exciting and engaging curriculum. In this issue, we take a look at what the children in EYFS have been up to recently.

EYFS have been looking at Goldilocks and the Three Bears so have had porridge and oats for children to explore through touch and smell. They have carried out food tasting of porridge and of bear toast, talking about their sense of taste and discussing whether they liked the porridge or not. Outside there has been a lot of ice due to the very cold weather. The children have been exploring the ice, touching it, breaking it on the floor, and leaving some to see what happens to it when it warms up (observing that it melts when brought into the class!)

As part of The Gingerbread Man story the children are leaving some gingerbread in different food sources to see what happens e.g. water, oil, milk, flour, salt, so that they can see whether the Gingerbread Man could have got over the river without using the fox. They have talked about how they think the gingerbread will go 'mouldy' or 'soggy' in water so this theory is being tested. The unit will finish with the children making their own gingerbread men!

As well as the planned units of work, we also take time to learn about different

celebrations. We have had a lovely time finding out about Chinese New Year. The food tasting proved very popular!

In addition, we are grateful for all the visitors that come into school to enhance our learning and bring the curriculum to life. We have been very lucky to have visits from the oral hygiene team at Buntingford Dental Practice and were pleased to take home some more toothbrushes and toothpaste. We also had a very exciting visit from some puppies that belong to one of our families!

Annual Parish Meeting:



Standon Parish Council is delighted to announce that our MP, Mr Chris Hinchliffe, will attend the Annual Parish Meeting to be held in the Williams-Davies Hall on Thursday 24 April commencing 7.30pm. If you have a question you want Mr Hinchliffe to answer, please email the clerk so that he has time to research a response, or come along on the day.

Puckeridge Tributary Main River

The Puckeridge Tributary has been running very high again and, when combined with the constant flow from the Pumping Station in Cambridge Road down to Station Road and into the river for over 3 months now, there is concern from residents who live alongside the Tributary that there is increasing risk of flooding (in 2014 flooding was caused by a blockage to the Tributary) and erosion of the banks. Those living alongside the Tributary have Riparian Ownership and this means they must maintain the bank

their side and up to the centre of the Tributary. Residents are asked to ensure that no loose objects are kept close to the river bank, and that any buildings in close proximity to the river bank are regularly inspected, including the ground beneath the buildings, as bank erosion may undermine a building and it may then get washed way and create a blockage.

This is not a ditch – it is a main river and must be treated as such.

Allotments:

There are a number of vacant allotments, many of which need to be cleared. If you want to take on an allotment which needs to be cleared before you can cultivate it, you will be entitled to a significantly reduced rent in the first year. Please contact the Clerk for more details.

Allotment tenants are reminded that produce cannot be sold – it can only be used by your own family and friends. No commercial activity is allowed.

People who go to the allotments are reminded that dogs must be kept on leads, and the produce is only available to those who are allotment holders. Produce is not grown for anyone to take. If you want fresh vegetables, please contact the Clerk and rent your own plot.

Burrs Meadow: Horse Chestnut Tree

The Parish Council's arborist has inspected this important tree. He has said that it is not at risk at the moment. The Parish Council has agreed to plant another tree now which will replace the Horse Chestnut tree in the street scene when it eventually fails. It will have to be planted further into the meadow to ensure it will not be impacted by the Horse Chestnut, and will be a mature specimen when the Horse Chestnut is removed.

Highways:

Flooding remains a huge issue in the village and several more vehicles have ended up in Gravelly Lane Ford. We are discussing with Highways how to improve safety, specifically replacing the depth indicator by the ford (which is pretty much illegible). We are pleased that the drains along Hay Lane have been cleared out however with the mud and the traffic along there it won't be long before they block again (already the bus stop at Hay Street is flooded because of the drain). We are trying to find a solution to parking in the Street especially the narrow part opposite the Brown Bear where the houses are being damaged by large vehicles (many agricultural vehicles) which are struggling to get through.

Planning:

We still await the outcome of the retrospective planning request at Riversmeet. We have also opposed a new development at Larks Hill.

Speeding:

Thanks to Cllr Ayes for an excellent presentation on the results of our Speeding Survey in the village. We will now be sharing the results with highways,

County Cllr Jeff Jones and the Police to try and find a way forward to improve the safety of our village.

Pentlows:

We are still awaiting the visual representation of Pentlows Meadow. Hopefully we will be able to share this at our next Meeting.

This will be re-sited under the willow tree by the main ford



Ben in Year 3 said "Our new library is very special and it's important that we learn to read. We are very thankful for having such a special place to read."

Local Hertfordshire author Alice Hemming officially cut the ribbon and led an assembly to the whole school, talking about her passion for books and writing stories. The school partnered up with local bookshop The Book Nook in Ware, where children had the opportunity to get their books signed by Alice Hemming afterwards.

Headteacher, Mr Sadler would also like to thank the residents of Braughing and the surrounding community of the school. "We could not have installed this library without the money raised from the Braughing Wheelbarrow race. The amount raised through raffle tickets sales and drinks sold from the Jenyns bar contributed a huge chunk of the funding needed. Your involvement and generosity truly make a difference, and we are deeply grateful to be part of such a wonderful and supportive community."



'Hand Crafted In Hertfordshire



In 2012 my wife and I planted a small vineyard (only 2300 vines) in Little Hadham here in Hertfordshire. To be perfectly honest we did not realise what hard work it would be. We followed this idea by building a winery in 2013 so we could grow our own grapes and, with the help of an award winning winemaker, make English Sparkling Wine. This was a retirement project that has taken over our life, in a good way, since 2012.

We make an average of 1,500 bottles per year of English Sparkling Rose and Blanc de Blancs wine which we sell locally. Most small vineyards send their grapes away for the wine to be made by specialist winemakers, we wanted to make our wine here at Four Acres and enjoy and control every part of the process which is very satisfying.

As I am writing this article in January we are pruning the vines and to date (23rd January) have pruned over 1,000 vines. We are also working in our winery. At the moment we are hand riddling 720 bottles of Blanc de Blancs ready to complete the final stage of the sparkling wine process which is disgorging (removing the yeast from the bottles).

Men - Setting the scene

Overall, more men (69.2%) than women (58.6%) are classed as living with overweight or obesity (Obesity Profile: short statistical commentary May 2024).

Waist circumference is a good measure of fat around your middle. This type of fat builds up around your organs, and is linked to high cholesterol, high blood pressure and type 2 diabetes (British Heart Foundation). Men with a waist circumference between 94–102cm (37-40in) are 'high risk', and more than 102cm (40in) is 'very high' (NHS Trust).

Doorsten Crime Increases

Trading Standards is seeing an increase in doorstep crime incidents, especially driveways and roofing/guttering work.

The rogue trader can contact you in many ways:

- a cold-call/'working in the area',
- a leaflet through the door, or
- in response to a post on a trader matching website.

Alarm bells should ring when a small job turns into a bigger one or if there are unexpected price increases. A common example is a simple job such as cleaning the gutters that is 'bounced' by identifying more work that the trader says needs doing urgently, like loose tiles, compromised felt or rotten timbers. Or, a price is agreed for a new driveway, but later the trader tells you that the price did not include materials or VAT.

Be suspicious if an expensive quote is quickly reduced, on condition the work is carried out straightaway. Beware if the trader claims the job is urgent and pressure is put on you to agree.

Another warning sign is a lack of paperwork before work starts. Look for full information about the trader: their legal entity, address, contact details, company status, full description of works and materials to be used, full cost including whether VAT is included, how long the job will take,

and proper cancellation rights given at the right time.

Don't feel trapped into using the same trader, even though it seems to make sense while they are on your property. The law protects you in this situation by giving you a 14-day cancellation period for work that is agreed at your home. Only you can agree for the work to commence within the cancellation period if you want it to.

Our advice is to make use of the cancellation period to reflect:

- speak to someone you trust about what has happened,
- seek a second opinion from a trustworthy, local trader via www.hertfordshire.gov.uk/ goodtrader, and
- seek advice about your consumer rights from the Citizens Advice Consumer Service on 0808 223 1133.

If you have any concerns, you can report them to the Citizens Advice Consumer Service on 0808 223 1133. Report frauds to the Police by contacting Action Fraud on 0300 123 2040. Call 999 if the trader is aggressive or starts work without your agreement, these are 'crimes in action', do not feel that it is a waste of anyone's time. Please look out for any vulnerable neighbours and report concerns to us.

Riparian Ownership

Properties Forming a Boundary To The Puckeridge Tributary

If you own land alongside a watercourse, you are legally termed a Riparian owner.

A riparian owner is the person, or people, with watercourses on, next to or under their property. Riparian owners have the responsibility for maintenance of these watercourses.

Riparian responsibilities usually lie with the person who owns the land or property. Sometimes it is the tenant depending upon the agreement in place.

Where a watercourse forms a boundary, the riparian ownership responsibilities are shared equally with the owners of the land on the opposite bank. This is unless property deeds or land registry show other arrangements.

You have the right to protect your property from flooding and erosion, but you must:

get <u>permissions to build anything in or</u> around the watercourse

NOT build anything which could divert water and increase flood risk to other people's property, or you may have to pay damages The Puckeridge Tributary, northern reach, upstream of the A10, is not owned or maintained by the Environment Agency. Maintenance of in channel and bank vegetation is the responsibility of the riparian owner, (person(s) who own the land bordering the river).

From the Rector

Dear friends.

That's another fine mess...

Some of the old Hollywood black and white comedies are still hilarious; one such is Laurel and Hardy. Like many comedies, they had a catch-phrase: "That's another fine mess you've gotten me into, Stanley". As I look around our situation it seems to feel like that the whole time. Our rivers are polluted; the kind of houses we want aren't build, but the kind we don't want are; our health service is, to put it mildly, struggling; discrimination and racism seems to be on the rise; we cannot control the effects of social media; our young people are increasingly without hope; economic growth appears impossible. There are, of course, some good things happening, but overall, it appears we are on the slide.

What can we say about all these "messes"? I think it all points to a much deeper malaise. Commentators, thinkers and historians are all suggesting that we are in the twilight years of western civilisation and, as one indication of that, we have lost our uniting "story". That story was, of course, the Christian story. We can see how much that is lost by our collective ignorance of the story but also by the loss of the values that were held. Of the 10 commandments, only theft and murder remain as values we aspire to, and even those two are under threat. Of the so -called seven deadly sins, perhaps only sloth is still seen as negative. The others are pride, greed, envy, wrath, lust, gluttony. Pride is celebrated (e.g. you must have pride in yourself...); without greed and envy our economy would soon collapse; wrath is everywhere on the internet, and the primeval urges of lust and gluttony are celebrated in advert and

film. This diagnosis is now commonly accepted, to the extent that there is a call for a return to Christian values without the faith and the content of the story behind it. But it is not enough just to return to the values; we also need to accept the story and spiritual life for

In this context, the words of Jesus of Nazareth are truly revolutionary. Your old medieval church may seem old-fashioned and reactionary, but in fact we follow a transforming belief. Our founder said, "Love your neighbour". "Love your enemy". "Lay down your life for your friends". "Give away your wealth". "Seek first God's Kingdom". "Do to others as you would have them do to you". "Whoever wants to be first must be slave of all". "Do not store up treasures on earth". No sign here of greed, or envy, or gluttony. Naturally we Christians fail, and fail often. (And the institution of the church has recently failed even more). But to these values we aspire. And to the story we hold true.

As Easter approaches the old story that Jesus died and rose again, and sent his Holy Spirit gives us both hope and power to carry on. To some it looks as though the church in the West will die. To me, when I see people hold to the words of Jesus and keep to the story, I know that is impossible. For it is a sign, in the messes around us, that God is in our midst, transforming our community. He will not leave, because he loves us. He died for us and rose to new life. In your old medieval churches, we still hold to the stories and to the words of Jesus. Indeed, in the words of another old film, "The Greatest Story ever told". You are always welcome!

Barkway Market

Hertfordshire's popular country event, Barkway Market, will return on Saturday 10 May.

If you're looking to spend a day in the country to enjoy a quintessential day out in an idyllic setting, Barkway Market on Saturday 10 May, is for you.

One of Hertfordshire's popular country shows, Barkway Market is held within the beautiful grounds of Manor Farm, one of the village's oldest houses, alongside a craft fair in the neighbouring Church.

The event, which is held in Barkway is part of the old London to Cambridge coaching route, and is expected to attract over 4,000 visitors. The event dates back to medieval times in 1270. It was reestablished in 1977 as a 'Street Market' when residents Molly Bruce, Mr Fidler and others wanted to raise money for a village party to celebrate the Queen's Silver Jubilee.

Barkway's Grade II Listed 'Carriage Wash', which can be found close to Manor Farm, is a monument to the coaching village's past, and was added to Historic England's National Heritage List in 2024.

The annual Market is organised by a team of volunteers on behalf of Barkway Village Hall, which is a registered charity and hosts many of Barkway's community groups. All proceeds go towards the running of the Hall and in 2024, just under £10,000 was donated to local community groups and projects. The Market is also an opportunity for local organisations to raise funds including the Barkway Church, The 7th Royston Barkway Scout Group, and Barkway School.

One of the main crops of the rich agricultural area covered by The Hundred Parishes is barley, the main ingredient of traditional ales and beer. In the past, much of the barley was malted locally before being taken to a nearby brewery to be combined with water, hops and yeast for fermenting into beer.

Brewing was initially a domestic activity in the home for family consumption, on farms and estates for the landowner's family and workers, and in various institutions such as religious communities for those who lived in and visited them. As the demand for beer grew (safer to drink than 'fresh' water at the time) so did the brewing industry: public houses having their own brewhouses, commercial brewers working out of stand-alone breweries, and then the development of industrial scale brewery complexes.

Evidence of all these different types of breweries is to be found within the

Hundred Parishes in the form of place names such as Brewery Lane in Stansted, Brewery House in Little Hadham; Little Brewers, a cottage in Matching Green; Brewery Cottage in Sewards End; and Brewers House in Dunmow.

There are also surviving examples of the breweries from each of the various phases of the development of the industry. At Audley End House the estate's brewhouse survives although the internal features have been lost. An example of a public house brewery survives as The Old Brewery in Radwinter, now a private house. In Hatfield Heath the former standalone brewhouse was converted to a corn mill before becoming commercial offices.

Three examples of brewhouses which were a part of industrial brewery complexes survive in Furneux Pelham, Wethersfield and Hartford End in Felsted. All three have been renovated and converted to private residential use.

Booking.com users targeted with scam messages

Insight from Action Fraud reports suggests the individuals were defrauded after receiving unexpected messages and emails from a Booking.com account belonging to a hotel they had a reservation with, which had been taken over by a criminal. Using this account, the criminals send in-app messages, emails, and WhatsApp messages to customers,



deceiving them into making payment and/or requesting credit card details.

The specific account takeovers are likely to be the result of a targeted phishing attack against the hotel or accommodation provider, and not Booking.com's backend system or infrastructure.

Adam Mercer, Deputy Head of Action Fraud, said:

"With more than 500 reports made to Action Fraud, those who have booked a holiday on the Booking.com platform should stay alert to any unexpected emails or messages from a hotel using the Booking.com platform, as their account could have been taken over by a criminal.

"If you receive an unexpected request from a hotel's account you booked with using Booking.com, asking for bank details or credit card details, it could be a fraudster trying to trick you into parting ways with your money. Contact Booking.com or the organisation directly if you're unsure.

"Remember to report any suspicious emails by forwarding it to report@phishing.gov.uk, or if you

receive a fraudulent text message, you can forward it to 7726."

How can you protect yourself? Booking.com and Action Fraud are providing the following advice on how to spot signs of fraud and protect your Booking.com account:

• No legitimate Booking.com transaction will ever require a customer to provide their credit card details by phone, email, or text message (including WhatsApp).

Sometimes a hotel provider will manage their own payment and may reach out to request payment information, like credit card details – before providing any information, always verify the authenticity of communication between yourself and the hotel's account.

If you receive any urgent payment requests that require immediate attention, like a booking cancellation, immediately reach out to the Booking.com Customer Service team via the details on the official Booking.com website and/or app to confirm.

Enjoying a winter stroll along any of the described walks in the Hundred Parishes is an opportunity to view the landscape. The spring of 2024 was rather wet, and this resulted in poor establishment of autumn-sown cereals. This, combined with the inclement conditions during harvesting, resulted in disappointingly low yields.

However, it seems that with dry weather in the autumn of 2024, the sown wheat, barley and oats have germinated well, with most fields now covered with fresh green shoots. Many farmers have decided to cut back on growing oil seed rape, and may choose to plant alternative niche crops such as sunflowers or borage once the weather is warmer.

These farmed landscapes have traditionally supported assorted wildlife including skylarks, rooks, ladybirds, bumble bees, butterflies, badgers and foxes. In addition, well maintained soils contain not just beneficial fungi, but a variety of earthworms and beetles which in turn provide food for many other creatures. Sadly, other less-welcome creatures such as slugs and root-eating beetle or fly larvae are also present. Seeing a sizeable flock of birds following a plough demonstrates this plethora of food!

Recent concerns about the loss of insect life, especially pollinators or those that eat aphids, is encouraging farmers to find ways of enhancing habitats for insects by leaving marginal strips round fields for wildflowers, planting new hedges or creating beetle banks within their fields. These features may be visible from footpaths during the winter months so make a note of where they are and plan return visits during the summer to observe them full of flowers and other wildlife.


